 - Requests from D22 to understand issues of DOE hierarchy, student learning and achievement
 - 9/12- Citywide Leadership Team Summit, email to join the summit
- Holly Spiegel
 - Resolution passed for reduction and re-examination of number of liockdowl drills and sent to House Assembly for bill
 - Parents to be notified in advance of the drills and be able to opt out; schools can conduct morel
 - Evidence of drills show a dramatic reduction of feelings of safety; children expressing more fear; parents don't have access to the script or protocols and can't adequately respond to their children's emotional needs
- Christina Caputo
 - First Come First Serve policy discriminates against participants
 - Drills- encouraging their assembly member to keep them, aiming for happy medium of preparation
- Nicole Barnett
 - Class size concern- decrease in enrollment for 2nd graders and district office has reduced funding for 3rd class. 32 2nd graders at her school, 889
 - Up. Bove is meeting at 889 and also looking to address the upcoming mandate; explained the issues of discrepancies between when school ends and families make changes, thus changing demographics
 - Reinforced by Shannon
- Leonie Haimson of Class Size Matters reported on lack of movement to reducing class size; there is a Class Size working group to come out with final recommendations at the3 end of October
