TEAMS

- Accessibility (NEW) works to ensure disabled and low-mobility participants have the accommodations they need to participate
- Art The Art Department stays connected with artists from initial inquiry about Art
 Registration and/or Art Grant Application, communicates with safety teams and BOD about
 amounts granted, fire and other safety concerns regarding interactive art and about
 feasibility and scope of art projects. Art Team also works closely with placement to ensure
 the best spot for any art projects. Art Department also sponsors various "art" activities
 throughout the burn, and works closely with Mission Control and Center Camp during the
 event.
- B.A.D. Weather (Burnado Atmospheric Department) onsite and offsite volunteer team monitoring radar software to track weather patterns directly on/around the property during events
- **Center Camp** Center Camp hosts your events. We provide the space, you provide the things to run your games, workshop, karaoke, etc.. Participation is key.
- **Conclave** Conclave is responsible for the Conclave fire spinning event that occurs just before the effigy burn and oversees the education of fire performers and their safeties to ensure a baseline of fire performance safety throughout the burn.
- **D.M.V.** Department of Mutant Vehicles is the workforce responsible for inspection, licensing and processing of Mutant Vehicles.
- **D.P.W.** Department of Public Works is the workforce dedicated to building the physical infrastructure, event logistics, and power management of the burn.

Education

- **Effigy-** This team is responsible for the construction of the main effigy burned on Saturday night.
- F.A.S.T. The Fire Art Safey Team inspects fire art at theme camps and art installations and
 oversees the effigy, temple, and any other structure burns during the event. This team helps
 provide a safe environment for fire art, the effigy, and the temple. They patrol the burn to
 help make sure that fire art and fire performance are safely done.
- Gate The Gate team is the first to welcome participants home, scan tickets, issue wristbands, check identification, solicit waivers agreement, and records emergency contact info.
- Greeters Responsible for the orientation and education of each and every arrival before setting them loose as newly indoctrinated citizens of To The Moon. Greeting is a vital role that helps shape and form the initial perceptions and expectations of first time participants.

Greeting is the one and only chance to communicate with each and every participant on a one-on-one basis.

- Lake Shuttles The Lake Shuttle team assists with transporting burners and their floaties to the lake and back
- **Lamplighters** a solemn group of robed individuals with poles slung over their shoulders, wending their way through to provide the city with illumination. They light and place kerosene lanterns atop the wooden spires that line the most heavily trafficked areas of town. The lanterns burn through the night.
- **LNT** The Leave No Trace Team works to return the land back to its pre-event condition. The work ranges from removing large structures to picking up large and small bits of escaped trash and eradicating burn scars (the residue of fired sediment and ashes).
- LSD The Leadership Support Department volunteers work to support leadership and volunteer teams with food, water, and anything else they might need to stay safe and happy
- Media/Content Creation/Newsletter Manage and create content to share information with the community via fb, the newsletter, and the website and help with capturing content during the event. Collects announcements from the leadership team and creates a monthly newsletter to share with the community
- Mission Control These volunteers wrangle participants of the burn into needed volunteer positions to keep things running. VCs help people check their scheduled shifts as well as sign up for shifts. If you know how sexy volunteering is and want to meet like minded folks, this is a good team for you! We keep volunteers informed of updates during the burn and help teams fulfill unforeseen volunteer needs as they could arise during the burn. This is also a place for people to come get information about burn happenings, times, locations, and whereabouts to things such as: workshops, theme camps, and events. Sometimes we even help people find themselves!
- Parking Organize parking and direct cars to the appropriate spaces in the parking lot
- **Perimeter** This team sets up and maintains the burn perimeter around each burn to keep citizens safe. Help hold the line of safety and keep the Fire Burning.
- **Placement -** The Placement Team is made up of volunteers who facilitate the complex city planning and camp placement process to layout the neighborhoods of To The Moon.
- **Purchasing (Task Lead)** Coordinates with Quartermaster and the treasurer to purchase infrastructure and supplies for the volunteer teams
- Quartermaster Manages inventory and distribution of org. materials and infrastructure to various volunteer teams during the event
- Rangers Rangers are the "first response" team. Rangers are out in the city, connecting with participants and keeping an eye out for situations that need attention.

- **Sanctuary -** A safe, quiet space for participants to come when they need to talk or get away from the sometimes overwhelming environment of a burn
- Shuttles Organize and oversee the running of a golf cart shuttle team
- **Signage/Print Team -** Create, post, & take down informational signage throughout the event. Facilitate printing various needs for all of leadership
- **Sound** Works with the placement team and theme camps to place sound camps in the best way and enforce the sound policy
- Survival Guide Creates and publishes the survival guide
- **Tech Team -** Manages all things digital for our community
- **Temple** This crew assembles and deploys the temple to be burned on the last night of TTM. Please note that a few hands are needed to help clean up on Monday after the Temple burn from the night before. Please be sure to pack up your camp before reporting for this shift as the burn will be ended and this shift requires "late stay" permission.

OTHER

- BOD The Board of Directors guides the business side of the event, working with vendors and the ELT to create a safe space to burn
- **Department Leads -** The Event Lead Team organizes and leads all the various volunteer teams to ensure a safe and successful event
 - Operations: DMV, DPW, Gate, Lake Shuttle, Lamplighters, LNT, LSD, Parking, Placement, Quartermaster, Shuttles, and Signage
 - Safety: BAD Weather, Conclave, Effigy, FAST, Perimeter, Rangers, Sanctuary, Sound, and Temple,
 - Experience: Accessibility, Art, Center Camp, CoCC, Education, Greeters, Media, Mission Control, Survival Guide, and Tech
