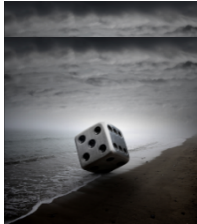

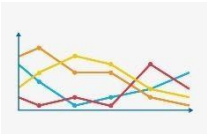

NYW: start sentences with a verb When you start a sentence with a verb (action), it makes the verb more important. The verb is followed by a comma, then a name or personal pronoun (he, she, they, it) followed by the rest of the sentence. EXAMPLES: Running, Sarah almost tripped over her own feet. Tiptoeing, he tried to sneak across the landing without waking anyone. Write ten sentences starting with a verb. You could find ideas for your sentences by looking at: pictures on Pobble 365, outside, pictures in a book or family photos.	NYW: compare temperatures in two locations Go to the met office website: https://www.metoffice.gov.uk/weather/forecast/five-day and type Pontypridd in the 'Search for a place' bar. Make a list of the predicted temperatures for seven days starting from today. Now do the same for a place in another country (e.g. Rome in Italy, Madrid in Spain or New Delhi in India.) Create a line graph on HWB using this data. Go to office 365, excel, start new workbook. Once you have inputted data, highlight, go to insert and click line graph. Don't forget to save your work! Write 5 questions about your graph.	NYW: write a story Log on to our class account on Google for Education on Hwb (DW 2019 5/6) Open the document 'A Giant's Game' from Pobble 365. Complete the 'Sentence challenge' activity then write a story (include some onomatopoeia from your 'Sentence challenge' work).
