## The Law of Immigration and Citizenship

## 1. Becoming a Citizen

- 1.1. A Citizen must meet the following requirements:
  - 1.1.1. Own Property in Roma or a Roman territory
  - 1.1.2. Disclose any past criminal records
- 1.2. After a resident has received property and an endorsement, they are eligible for citizenship.
  - 1.2.1. Citizenship is granted at the discretion of the Consuls.
  - 1.2.2. Denials and Acceptances of citizenship can be appealed to the Emperor.

## 2. Retaining Citizenship

- 2.1. Inactive citizens are periodically removed from the Census by the joint consensus of the Consuls.
- 2.2. Convicted Criminals may have their citizenship revoked by the joint consensus of the Consuls as further punishment for their crimes.
- 2.3. Revocations of citizenship are appealable to the Emperor.
