**About this Presentation:**

Grief is a normal response to loss and yet it can feel abnormal in so many ways. This talk will discuss the various types of loss and grief often connected to addiction and offer strategies for supporting oneself and others. Special attention will be paid to the notions of grieving someone who is still alive but absent from day to day life, the impact on the brain when there is ongoing uncertainty, disenfranchised grief, navigating questions about the well-being of family members, and more.

**Objectives:**

Educate on various types of grief and loss including disenfranchised grief, nonfinite loss, and uncomplicated grief.  
Provide explanation of the stress response that results in 'symptoms' of grief such as fear, irritability or anger, lack of concentration, poor sleep, etc.  
Offer perspective to help attendees consider their experiences differently and strategies to help support self and others during times of grief and mourning.

- King/Queen Voting:** Only Highland High School students will be allowed to vote for the King and Queen. Voting will take place via google form between Mon., Jan. 10 thru Thurs., Jan. 13. Check your google classroom for the ballots.
- Security:** Please be sure to secure all valuables (cameras, cell phones, money) in a safe place. Highland High School is NOT responsible for lost or misplaced items.  
**NOTE: All coats MUST be checked in (free) at the coat check.**  
(They may not be taken into the ballroom for the dance.)
- Masks:** All participants will be **REQUIRED** to wear a mask at all times.  
\*Please keep this in mind **BEFORE** purchasing a ticket - **NO REFUNDS**.  
Everyone will receive a wristband upon entering the dance. If a student is not wearing their mask, a chaperone will remove their wristband. If they are found without a mask and a wristband, they will be removed from the dance (See Note 1).  
**NOTE 1:** Under these circumstances, if a student needs to wait for a ride, he/she will be placed in a supervised room outside of the main room, away from other students, until their ride arrives.  
**NOTE 2:** Masks may **ONLY** be removed while drinking a refreshment while sitting at a table.

Beginning September 7, 2021 STOH will be requiring masks for all students and staff preschool through twelfth grade. This change was made in response to the most recent executive order signed by Governor Holcomb stating any district requiring masks will no longer need to quarantine asymptomatic close contacts out of school. This change is reflected in the close contact flowchart linked below.

As always, we will continue to monitor county and state trends. But most importantly we will be tracking and reporting our internal positivity rates in order to guide our decisions on any changes to mask requirements going forward.

Our goal is to return to masking being a personal choice, but the CDC, Lake County Health Department, and Indiana Health Department guidance along with our internal trends will determine when that will be a safe reality. Your patience, understanding, and support are appreciated.

Below are attachments to procedures all STOH schools will be using with regard to illnesses related and unrelated to Covid for the 2021-22 school year. Each Friday afternoon, we will continue to update a weekly Covid Dashboard found linked on the district's homepage. As we did last year, we will also send letters out to the affected school communities when we have cases.

Sharing proof of vaccination is completely voluntary. If you choose to share proof of vaccination, please use the subject line of the email to identify yourself as staff or student, the name or initials of your school, and then first and last name. In the body of the email you can upload a picture of your vaccination card or scan a copy of the doctor's paperwork listing the dates when your shots were given.
