Stage 1: Desired Results

General Information

Benzinger Family Life Curriculum has been replaced by *Growing with God: Safe and Sacred.* The Department of Catholic Schools has decided that 5 of the 6 lessons in the Growing with God: Safe and Sacred Family Life Curriculum will better serve our students at the beginning of the year. Therefore, we are asking that the following lessons be taught from the *Growing with God: Safe and Sacred* Family Life Curriculum at the *start of this unit*. Then, you may continue teaching the remaining standards in this unit. Each lesson takes about 1 hour.

Please refer to the Teacher Guide for Lessons 1, 2, 3, and 5. Lesson 7 is in the Booster Pack. As a reminder, *Lesson 4 is not taught*. Use the Growing with God Teacher Information Guide to support you with implementation of Growing with God lessons. The lessons are:

For the remaining parts of this unit, please refer to the information below:

- In this unit students will develop an appreciation for everything and everyone as a gift from God.
- Students will also learn about the Sign of the Cross.
- Students will learn about the Sacrament of Baptism and what it calls us to do.
- The feast days and liturgical celebrations during this time frame in which these lessons take place (per Unit 1) are: Ordinary Time, the Rosary, St. Francis of Assisi...
- Scripture stories that can be incorporated into this unit are:
 - o Psalm 139:14; Mark 16:15
 - o John 12:23-24; John 15:5-7; John 3:16
 - Ephesians 2:19–22; 1 John 3:1;1 Peter 2:10
 - o Mark 7:31-37; 1 Peter 2:9

- How can we share God's gifts with others?

Skills

Students will be able to:

- · Recognize signs of Baptism.
- Describe the gifts of God's love that are experienced each day.
- Explain that God's gifts are for sharing and how we can give ourselves as gifts.
- Explain that we are made in the image of God and name three things we can do because we are created in God's likeness (think, choose, and love).
- Describe God's care for creation.
- Explain why people are especially important to God.
- Talk about trust in our heavenly Father's care.
- Explain that Jesus showed the Father's love by dying and rising to give us new life.
- Describe ways to express their love of the Father and his Son, Jesus.
- Identify the disciples and themselves as members of the Church.
- Name ways to follow Jesus more closely.
- Describe how Baptism helps us to hear God's Word and spread it to others.
- Describe the significance of and how to make the Sign of the Cross.
- Explain how the Sign of the Cross is a sign of Jesus' love.
- Identify themselves as God's children through Baptism.
- Discuss the baptismal promises.
- Explain that Church membership is expressed in a life of love according to Jesus' teachings.

Creed

Sacraments

- 2.10.04 Understand that Jesus commands us to love God and our neighbor. (Lk 10:25-28; Mk 12:28-34; Matt 22:34-40)

Ecumenism & Inter-religious Dialogue

Standard 11: ECUMENISM AND INTER-RELIGIOUS DIALOUGUE: Understand and participate in the call of the Church to be a sign of unity in the world through knowledge of and collaboration with Christian churches and all faith traditions.

- 2.11.01 Recognize that Jesus founded the Catholic Church so that we would all be one.
- 2.11.02 Know that Catholic means "universal."
- 2.11.04 Understand that other Christians share a common baptism and belief in Jesus even though they do not share the fullness of all that Jesus taught us.
