In One Sentence:

Small Group Instruction is delivering instruction to students based on needs.

The Hattie Check:

- Response to Intervention = 1.09
- Teacher Clarity = 0.75
- Repeated Reading Programs = 0.75
- Comprehensive Instructional Programs for Teachers = 0.72

What's the Point?

- To provide students differentiated instruction based on their needs within the small group led by the teacher.
- The decreased teacher to student ratio provides teachers the opportunity to focus their attention on individual students and smaller groups of students.
- Systematic lesson plans designed to improve teacher clarity.

How is Small Group Instruction used by Teachers?

• Teachers use Small Group Instruction to provide Tier 1 and Tier 2 support to students based on identified needs from the Core Standards, screeners, diagnostic assessments, and common formative assessments.

How is Small Group Instruction used by Students?

- Students participate in small group settings by listening, collaborating, reading, writing, responding per teacher instruction.
- Students receive structured lessons designed to fill in gaps, build on, and expand student learning.
- Students can also work in student led groups based on interests and choice.
