Робота оцінюється у 12 балів. Максимальна кількість балів за роботу – 60 . Для визначення оцінки, яку отримав здобувач освіти, загальну кількість балів за контрольну роботу треба поділити на 5 (кількість завдань). Для прикладу, здобувач освіти набрав 52 бали – $52: 5 = 10,4$ – оцінка 10 балів.
