FIRST-ROUND DELIVERABLES AND SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

The first round of the competition will take place via the RocketJudge platform, which will provide each team with a unique link to its virtual presentation/competitor room. On Saturday morning, March 19, each team will present its first-round presentation in its unique RocketJudge presentation/competitor room. Teams will be able to share their slides on the RocketJudge screen and interact with their first-round judges in this virtual competitor/presentation room.

On Tuesday, March 15 from 6:00 – 10:00 pm EDT, RocketJudge will send each team its unique link to its virtual competitor/presentation room and its Competition Day timeslot. Teams may access their virtual competitor room once they receive their unique link so that they can become familiar with the platform. The first-round deliverables are a slide deck of your team's case solution presentation.

Slide Deck Format

Teams can submit a .pdf of their slide deck **OR** a web-based slide deck (e.g., Google slides). **If submitting a web-based link to your slides, please ensure that anyone with the link can access the slide deck (e.g., share your document appropriately).**

Presentation Content

Please include your **team number**, the **name of your team members**, the **title of your case solution**, and **numbers on each slide** as this will help judges keep track of teams presenting and better facilitate their Q&A process. Teams are also encouraged to build appendix slides to help answer questions that they anticipate the judges will ask during the Q&A session. Teams should also consider hyperlinking their appendix slides to a main appendix directory slide so that you can easily access information you are looking for during the Q&A portion of the presentation. **Do NOT put anything on your slide deck that will identify your university affiliation.**

Late Submission Penalties

- o From 5:00 pm to 5:10 pm, a 5-point deduction for each minute.
- o From 5:11 – 5:30 pm, a 10-point deduction for each minute.
- o If a team turns in its presentation after 5:30 pm, it will be disqualified from the competition.

First-Round Submission Instructions

Each team will submit its first-round deliverables electronically via a RocketJudge Submission Form (see above) and that EGHl will provide to team captains when the case is released on Friday, March 11. You are required to submit the following information when you submit your slide deck:

- Team Number
- Title of Case Solution
- 1-2 Sentence Description of Case Solution
- PDF or Web-based Slide Deck (*remember to share your slides so that anyone with a link can see them!*)
- Name of Team Captain
- Email Address of Team Captain

Competition Day Presentation Time and Format

- o **10 minutes** are allotted to present the case solution
- o **8 minutes** are allotted to a Q&A session with the judges
- o EGHl will provide timekeepers
- o Any leftover time will be utilized as the judging panel sees fit.

You will be responsible for sharing your slide presentation via the RocketJudge platform screen as you present.

A case competition planning team member will attend your presentation and serve as the timekeeper. The timekeeper will verbally let you know when you have 5-minutes, 2-minutes, 1-minute, and no time remaining for your team's presentation and Q&A session.

Please note that you can practice your presentation as much as you like after you submit your slide deck on Friday, March 18, but you **should NOT** change the text of your slides prior to your Saturday morning presentation.

First-Round Presenters

As many team members can participate in the presentation as the team deems appropriate. Team members who do not participate in the presentation are expected to participate in

the Q&A session with the judges. Team members that controlled the slide presentation should assign that role to other team members during the Q&A portion so that they can participate in the Q&A.
