Preparation prior to the lesson	Print the Flat Handshape Signs Sheet and write the words (for the signs) on the whiteboard.	
Learning Intention	Revise the handshapes that we have been taught. Revise some signs that use these handshapes.	
Success Criteria	 Identify the handshapes by name, when shown. (receptive understanding) Form the handshapes when given their title/name. (expressive) Recall a sign(s) that uses the handshapes. Create a clause/story using a combination of some Flat handshape signs. 	

Time	Teacher	Resources
5 mins	Set up the video to watch. Students seated on the floor.	
5 mins	Introduction: Introduce the topic - Back to Basics - Handshapes Today we are revising the handshapes that we have learnt. These handshapes are the basis of how signs are formed. We've learnt so many over the last few years, so it's a great idea to revisit and revise them. I wonder how many that you will remember! Make the handshapes with the video when shown. (Start of Lesson) Read and discuss the Learning Intention and Success Criteria. Check for understanding, clarifying	
10 mins	vocabulary as necessary. Explicit Teaching: Watch the video Use teacher discretion to decide if the class needs to watch any part of the video a second time. Handshapes revised this lesson: Flat, good, five, point, hook, claw, spoon, rabbit, okay, fist, cup, bent flat, soon, plane, bent two, wash, eat, gun, wish.	Lesson 38 video Handshapes: Flat - Mum, Good - Beach Five - When? Point - What? Hook - sister Claw - Scared Spoon - Name Rabbit - Young Okay - Yellow Fist - Pig Cup - Cousin Bent Flat - Room Soon - After Plane - maybe Bent two - Train Wash - Bath Eat - Picnic Gun - Why? Wish - Responsible/ responsibility
5 mins	 Explanation of Activity: Practice the handshapes previously taught that are shown in the video. Flat handshape sign clauses. The teacher shows the Flat Handshape Signs Sheet and the signs are practised together. The words are also written on the whiteboard mum, school, sad, dog, pizza, basketball, want, play, where, go. (10 signs) The students work with a partner to create one or more clauses/stories using some (2 - 3 or more) of these Flat handshape signs only, e.g. mum go pizza want. Dog sad want basketball play. The students return to the class group to share their 'creations'. Can the other students 'read back' your clauses? 	

15 mins	 Activity: Practice the handshapes previously taught that are shown in the video. Flat handshape sign clauses. Creating clauses/stories by combining some of the flat handshapes. No other signs used. Return to the Class group to share their Auslan clauses. 	
5 mins	 Reflection with Students: (Select from the following options) Can you believe that we have learnt 19 handshapes? Wow! How many handshapes did you remember? Did you know other signs that use these handshapes? Do you recall other signs that use the FLAT handshape? (day, blue, green, stop) Was it difficult to combine the FLAT handshape signs in a meaningful way?
