

Teaching Note-taking Skills During a Lecture or Video

Objective: Students will develop effective note-taking skills by applying strategies to take organized and meaningful notes during a lecture about the pros and cons of school uniforms.

Materials:

- Whiteboard or chalkboard
- Markers or chalk
- Student notebooks or lined paper
- Colored pens or highlighters

Lesson Sequence:
