It should include the research problem, objectives, methods or approach, and the main findings and conclusions. The abstract should be 100–250 words in length and must not contain references or citations. Standard and clear terminology should be used, and uncommon abbreviations must be defined at first mention. The abstract is followed by a maximum of five keywords that support indexing and do not repeat terms already used in the title. (9pt, Single Space)

The article is formatted in two columns on A4-sized paper with normal margins. The manuscript is prepared using Microsoft Word, single-spaced, in 11pt Times New Roman font, and must not exceed 12 pages. Terms written in foreign languages should be italicized (italic).

The Introduction section presents the background of the study by explaining the context and significance of the research problem. It describes current conditions, existing challenges, and their relevance to the field of Information and Communication Technology. This section also includes a brief review of related previous studies to position the research within existing literature. Furthermore, the research objectives, expected

contributions, and the novelty or originality of the study are clearly stated.

2. RESEARCH METHOD (Times New Roman 11 Bold)

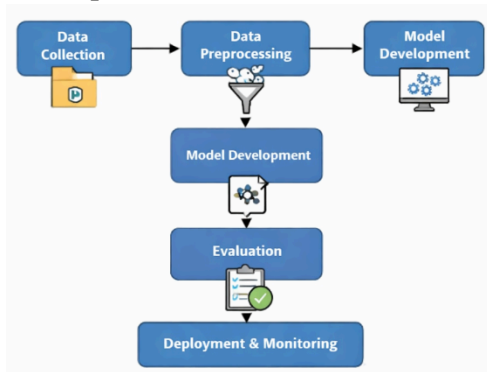


Figure 1. Workflow of the proposed AI-based research process. (Times New Roman, 10 pt)

The Research Method section explains the procedures and stages of the study in a systematic and structured manner. It describes the research type and approach, data sources, data collection techniques, tools or instruments used, and data processing and analysis methods. For studies involving system development, models, or algorithms, this section also explains the system design, architecture, and workflow to ensure the research can be replicated by other researchers. **Figure 1 and Table 1 should be**

presented in center alignment, as shown below, and must be cited within the manuscript.

3. RESULT AND DISCUSSION (Times New Roman 11 Bold)

The Results and Discussion section presents the findings obtained from the research based on the applied methods. The results may be shown in the form of tables, figures, or graphs, accompanied by clear explanations. The discussion interprets the results critically, compares them with related studies, and links the findings to relevant theories or concepts. This section also explains the implications of the results for scientific development or practical applications in the field of Information and Communication Technology.

3.1 Sub Section 1 (Subtitle Times New Roman 11pt)

Equations should be written at the center of the line and numbered sequentially, with the equation numbers placed in parentheses at the right margin. To ensure consistency and proper formatting, the use of Microsoft Equation Editor or MathType is recommended. All symbols and notations appearing in the equations must be clearly defined in the accompanying text.

3.2 Sub Section 2 (Subtitle Times New Roman 11pt)

All references to previous works must be cited correctly to prevent plagiarism. Citations are indicated using reference numbers in square brackets, such as [16], or multiple numbers when more than one source is cited. When a citation appears at the beginning of a sentence, the format “Ref. [18]” should be used. For references with three or more authors, only the first author’s name is listed, followed by *et al.* Examples of different reference types are provided in the References section, and all reference entries should be written using an 10-point font size.

This section expresses gratitude to individuals, institutions, or organizations that provided support, assistance, or funding for the completion of the research.

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The References section lists all sources cited in the manuscript. References must be written consistently and accurately according to the citation style required by the journal, such as the IEEE style. All cited references

should appear in the reference list to ensure the credibility and traceability of the scholarly sources. **The reference list should be written using a 10-point font size.**
