Here are the steps to access the Common Sense Education Digital Citizenship Lessons for 6-8 in Nearpod:

- 1) Go to <u>nearpod.com</u> on your teacher machine.
- 2) Click "Sign In", the blue bubble button on the upper right of the screen
- 3) To sign in, click the lowercase "g" inside the blue circle at the bottom of the sign in page. (This will use your school Google account, which is how you are registered.)
- 4) Click "Allow". You should now be signed in to Nearpod. If not, please get in touch with me.
- 5) Click on Explore.
- 6) In the "Search Lessons" box at the top, please search for "Digital Citizenship 6-8".
- 7) Click on the "Digital Citizenship 6-8 BUNDLE",
- 8) Click the blue button that says "Add to My Library"
