Gary - It would be great if Enzo could give Jack and Kaisa a heads up that I may be inviting them to provide an update to Certifications Committee next year.

Neil - I volunteer to participate in Strategic Planning. 2 issues on how to work internationally. The other issue from Mal criticizing ZWIA for participating in the ZW Forum in Istanbul and other issues. We need to address the criticisms.

Ruth - Would like to get input from

Rodrigo, Mal and Gerry were very suspicious about the Foundation.

Our approach. We signed MOU and welcome the ZW Fdn to international ZW community. Any concerns to work with them, rather than an antagonistic alternative force.

For those in Istanbul

Jamie - didn't have much interaction with the Foundation itself, other than the hosts who helped us move around. But did talk with a lot of organizations brought in as partners. Felt they were legitimate and doing ZW in the right way. Interesting experiment: State led organization bringing in great ZW organizations from around the world. They're not as knowledgeable in ZW. Didn't have concepts of policies, hierarchy. Huge possible learning curve to get through. Throughout the conference, presenters presented what they wanted to say. Some spoke against incineration and some for. Some spoke on reuse and recycling. There was no controlling of the message from what I saw.

Where it fell flat: at the end of the Forum the Energy Minister spoke about how they're burning 10% of their waste in Turkiye. Never came out before then in the conference. He also talked about renewable energy such as wind and solar so WTE was only one direction. I felt it was more about lack of education on ZW than a firm policy or direction.

Seemed lack of education in knowing his audience. Not understanding connections between waste and energy.

Believe there's enough organizations on our side of issues so optimistic.

Q - how they move forward, and what their next steps are? How they welcome involvement from organizations brought in will be the test.

They also claimed to start the whole movement in 2017, even though they brought all of us in. We need to push on and address that so that they do acknowledge the wider ZW movement. They are from what I can see is the only Country adopting this but so far only in name and have not themselves referenced the definition or any of the policies.

Ruth - was that just a misunderstanding of what was said about the founding of ZW in Turkiye?

Jamie - you'd think that. But didn't mention or acknowledge others, seemed more focused on Turkiye. 1st lady there and wanted to make sure this state run initiative was grandiose.

Could have given recognition to other organizations.

One presentation was most on target - Amily from GAIA Asia Pacific, included international definition of ZW and ZW Hierarchy.

Saleem Ali (the sole representative from the U.S. on the UN ZW Advisory Board) was the moderator of that session that was on the Definition of ZW, and he validated her anti-incineration points.

Now is time to get more involved and talk with those on the Committee. Talked with Saleem Ali. Trying to get some of our members on those committees.

Good thing. Paid for our flights was important. Wouldn't have been able to go without that.

Elena - agree with what Jamie said. Great opportunity to bring together innovators, policy makers all discussing ZW and Circular Economy. Mentioned ZWIA in my session that I moderated. Great opportunity for us to contribute, on definition, Hierarchy. Open to Collaboration. Let's move forward. Incorporate everyone.

Manuela - Great opportunity to work together. Open for our participation. Good to work together. They plan to do thai next year.

Elena - Opportunity from civil society to be involved. They will invite many more including the grassroots movement

Ruth - did get application to participate for City of Alameda. That's grassroots.

Ruth - ZW USA planning national conference. Who should I reach out to? You're invited, and please don't do your Forum. We're planning 10/21-22.

Elena - UN HAbitat is moving to Istanbul

Istanbul

Neil - Qs - can wait until Rick comes back. Agree with Elena and Jamie that it was good for us to be at this event and be in this network. Will advocate for grassroots empowerment.

There are criticisms that ZWIA needs to address (e.g., Raytheon certified, and making \$ off ZW). Very confident we can defend ourselves well. Do need to ad

Ruth - Raytheon is old dead cow. We want to move forward not revisit the past.

I have no interest in talking about water over the dam from 10 years ago. Don't want to revisit that as ZWIA.

We really need to reach out to the Foundation and UN and embrace them and be part of our Encourage Turkiye as next National Affiliate.

Who should I contact to get involved.

Jamie - never met Mal or talked with him. I know he was involved in starting ZWIA. Feels like someone coming in from 20 years ago without understanding any of the organizations or context behind what or why the movement has gone in the direction it has. Lots of info seemed to be from ChatGPT which makes it very hard to follow with long letters and documents that have a lot of inconsistencies and changes in tone messaging and context. I am trying to keep up but as a volunteer it makes it hard. . . Bottom line is that ZWIA needs to figure out its direction, be more meaningful and grow. I had a conversation with Esra (ED of Zero Waste Europe, which is part of GAIA) on Wednesday. We spoke about this topic, and how ZWIA can work with GAIA, to better understand each other's roles. From the outside it is not clear who's running the ZWIA ship, how it is running or in what direction. GAIA as a whole finds it hard to work with ZWIA without clear contacts and without clear direction on how that collaboration will work. There is a desire to work together but also to grow in our own directions. Working together is the more preferred direction if we can work through some of the differences and harmonize some of our governance structure.

Rodrigo, during the Conference shared 7 principles of ZW. I haven't read them, but we should understand how they might differ from the ZW Hierarchy. At this point I don't know if they do. The question from GAIA was how does ZWIA address an affiliate sharing their own principles and policies for ZW? I said I would bring this up at the next meeting.

Ruth - don't lead with the funding, cup in hand. Let's collaborate on what we know they need - definitions, principles, hierarchy. **Projects that need funding would be lower priority.**

Gary - I believe items a to c above do what you're suggesting Ruth.

Ruth - did you get contact info from other people who attended the Global ZW Forum. Would be good to reach out to them, to share info and training opportunities?

Been back and forth at 3 am with Turkiye Foundation. Got plane ticket this week. Flying via Panama - 13 hour straight flight Panama to Turkiye. On way back 25 hours through Colombia.

I sent Qs to speakers, addressed to each speaker.

I arrive 10/15 afternoon.

Pal arrives 10/14 afternoon.

MOU signers on 10/16

I accepted MOU as is. Used same one for ZWIA, but changed Mission/Vision paragraph.

Did get invite to signing ceremony.

They didn't send email regarding MOU.

Very hectic. Lot of work. Very exciting. Upward learning curve. Taken AI classes this year.

Rick - haven't heard from them lately. Know about the meeting on 10/16.

We're arriving Tuesday. Wednesday

Thursday for MOU meeting.

Elena - someone will pick us up at the airport. We're staying at the Hilton. They booked the entire hotel. Go to hotel. They didn't provide specific confirmation. They stamped official ZW Foundation paper, but no confirmation number.

Elena - if Laura downloads WhatsAp on your phone, I can provide you Secretariat.

I can forward that contact via WhatsAp. Ruth's in WhatsAp group with you, Annemarie, Ruth and me. Forwarded to Rick and Chris Sparnicht.

Rick - I get in at 5 pm on 10/15.

Elena - so do I, coming from Frankfurt.

Mahesh - I've got the flight. Arriving 1 pm on 10/14. Pal is arriving 4 pm on 10/14. I have sent my corrections to MOU. I made clear that we should follow the ZIWA ZW definition and no-burn technologies. I hope they'll accept that. They invited me to sign on 10/16. I'll email you the info I've sent to Turkiye. I'd like to get together with ZWIA folks

Rick - I'd like to do

Elena - 10/16 would be best. Maybe after the MOU signing?

Mahesh - before the signing would be better. 10/16. Breakfast on 10/16.

Elena - of course, hopefully we'll all be in the same hotel.

Mahesh - not received an agenda for 10/16.

Rick - I'm worried about air delays.

Mahesh - separate group on WhatsAp, including those attending (and Gary)

Elena - I'll do that. "ZWIA Global ZW Forum"

Mahesh - include Jamie as well, Pal,

Elena - Rick, Mahesh, Pal, Elena, Jamie, Rodrigo, Jamie

Rodrigo - depart 10/14, Florianopolis to San Paulo, Arrive Istanbul 10/15 10:55 am. There's meeting to sign on 10/15. I need to change my tickets, because they invited me for a meeting on 10/15 night to sign MOU. Ceremony/dinner.

Pal - i arrive 3:30 on 10/14

Mahesh - I arrive 1 pm on 10/14

Elena - I was told the signing of MOUs on 10/16.

Rodrigo - what do you think about this?

Rick - Saleem Ali said this is one event of 2-3 they're organizing

They're looking for info. We're looking for solidarity.

Gary -

Cara Silva will speak twice. He was President of ISWA.

Esra will speak twice

Mahesh - heard from GAIA. Sent them my MOU Draft with edits to follow international definition of ZW.

Rick - I'm planning to sign. Want to see what's in there.

Mahesh - when I talked with them, they said OK with no incineration. They promise that.

Pal - have you got MOUs?

Gary - MOUs

Pal - will stand behind.

Gary - is Rodrigo asking if we all will sign only if "no burning" clause is included, like Jamie and Mahesh have proposed?

Rodrigo - why this meeting? 2 concerns. 1) they have other vision about Zero Waste and want to make it "flexible" like others. And/or 2) they want to join the moment and create a movement supported by the government. Same thing as happened with Lets Do It, to spread the word.

They want to promote ZW around the world, next year in another place. Not just in Turkey.

My thought/concern: 1) new association that has support of the government of Turkey and new association that I don't trust. There's GAIA, ZW Europe (Esra) that I trust. The ZW Foundation wants to occupy the space of the ZWIA. If it's only one event in Turkey, would be like what I did in Brazil. We can support it, like everyone here supported me. The plan is more than this. Are they creating a company or a movement. Are they wanting us all inside this organization. If it's real, then have lot of concerns. They can change the Hierarchy, and try to be flexible.

I decided to go to see it and understand what's happening. Carla Silva has interfered in my country in Brazil, and in what we're doing in Brazil. He supports incinerators. That's got my attention.

Other side of my reflections is why I'm thinking this, ZWIA may be is not so strong and have reach that it could be. Need to reflect on that.

Pal - I agree with concerns. Big difference with this conference is that we are there. GAIA, zW Europe and ZWIA and Brazil, and Canada and Nepal. We are also watching what is happening.

If that want to do their thing differently, they can do that.

As long as we don't promote them or sign anything that's against our definition.

Rick - Dennis Uyat may be going there from Zero Waste USA.

Gary - we should ask Zero Waste USA to ask to be a partner.

Mahesh - The Hierarchy can come later. Main thing is getting agreement on the definition of ZW.

Gary - Move that ZWIA ask the Turkiye ZW Foundation include the clauses from Mahesh

Rodrigo - 2nd point - we have certification programs now. I don't want to create a new certification. Done for 30 years.

Mahesh - keep ongoing what we're doing now.

Rodrigo - certification for us is the "recognition". We don't need new certification. In Brazil, we've had ZW Academy. GAIA has ZW Academy.

Sandra Pinzon joined call.

Sandra - going to Turkiye. Added language to MOU that needs to align with international rules about circular economy (ISO59000).

Arriving on 10/15 and signing MOU on 10/16.

Mahesh - core needs to be definition, and non-incineration. Focus on those

Gary - agree. All propose to add 2 Whereas clauses and address certifications as follows:

WHEREAS, the Parties agree to promote as best practice the international Zero Waste definition posted on the website of the Zero Waste International Alliance (ZWIA), recognizing the shared vision of achieving Zero Waste societies and communities, and the mutual benefits of enhanced collaboration to advance our programs on Zero Waste systems while drawing on our respective expertise and international visibility; and

WHEREAS, both Parties explicitly affirm that they do not promote the burning, incineration, or any other similar destructive technologies as part of any Zero Waste system.

And

Change the 3rd bullet of Article II: Areas of Cooperation, 5. Academic and Education clause to "Support existing certification and recognition programs developed by ZWIA and other aligned institutions with local modifications as necessary." 7. U.S. National Zero Waste Conference, October 22-23, 2025 (see link for free registration below)

Rick - heard from Ruth, Chris Sparnicht did great job on the Green Garbage Patch film from Charlie Moore. Will use for Albatross film showing.

4. Discussion of Hughes Energy Proposal (see email below and similar email thread from May, 2025)

Defer to next month. I'll let Hughes know.

Enzo- don't see any need to discuss again. They point finger at maximum temperature. I'm supportive of higher temperature in our guidelines, since they are sometimes requested as pretreatment to ensure sanitisation e.g. of animal by-products to be then composted or digested in Europe.

The problem, though, is another one: Hughes are proposing this for mixed garbage. Clearly against our policy on A.D. and composting, which only considers composting as "diversion" if coming from separate collection. Also, in case they intend this as a "pretreatment" before landfilling, autoclaving - differently from biological stabilisation - does not stabilize organics permanently. Jamie - it doesn't count as diversion

Enzo - we're not forbidding it. But as proposed, it's just an extra cost before landfilling, without any benefit.

Medical waste - support as alternative to incineration them.

Great treatment for infectious waste, but not organics, and not for producing compost.

Ruth - agree.

- 5. Follow-up discussion of Issues raised by Global Zero Waste:
 - a. Traceability processes for issuing plastic credits, as is the case with the Global Zero Waste Voluntary Circular Economy Program. Global Zero Waste offer a free course on structuring projects for the issuance of plastic credits. Include discussion of Mass Balance Accounting.

Gary - I'll invite them

Jamie - same issue as credits in general. If doesn't reduce pollution for companies and let's them buy credits, doesn't help the environment.

Rick - I agree.

Enzo - I shared a paper which was co-authored by some prominent ZW opinion leaders. I do not mean we should bash plastic credits. I'd simply drag my (i.e. ZWIA's) feet from any type of involvement. Plastic credits are currently used to blur the lines in global strategies to tackle the plastic crisis. Would be awkward for ZWIA. Very confrontational in the global NGO Network and in discussions around the GPT.

Gary - they didn't ask ZWIA to do something

Enzo - I may be wrong, but I think they were sort of proposing ZWIA to promote the program and/or trainings. Would prefer not to have ZWIA involved on that, as issue is confrontational. Becoming particularly hot with Global Plastic Treaty, and given the use by petrochem who try through it to revive and keep producing plastics.

The certification program is working well, better than before.

We have issued reports on mass balance, including under RPA (rethink plastics alliance), which is pulling together main envt NGOs in Europe. That booklet includes the conditions under which the mass balance approach can be considered. As long as any credit system fully aligns. Can send that to you.

Sandra - we see great benefit of plastic credits. There are no perfect models. Carbon markets are also highly questioned.

Enzo - fully support efforts by Global ZW. We have defined boundaries of what's acceptable. Chemical recycling is in a very grey area. I will share booklet from RPA. Please check if you need to fine tune anything, or if there are any major problems with the methodology **EPR** programs Sandra - They have come to discuss the issue of waste in depth, creating a program led by Helen MacArthur. Within the framework of this project, we began a technical exploration and development of this voluntary program in 2021. Universal market. There were already other players.

6. ZW Brazil Updates

Gary - notes from Jan meeting where Rodrigo participated and provided update on Matheus leaving. Received email from Andre & Rodrigo and met with them this week.

Andre - context - last December, Mateus said he didn't want to work with ILZB any more. Wanted to transform his company to a tech company and he would sell software to companies. Rodrigo said OK and called me and asked me to be lead

Recently found Mateus approaching market and selling certification as a new approach. Lawyers got involved. Demands were amde to ask Mateus to stop.

He's still serving certification.

He hasn't given clients, students, courses, certifications details to ILZB. In middle of negotiations. Hope to have a document signed in a few days. Clients have been asking what's going on. We heard Mateus was using Global Zero Waste model, which is different than

Tiers for certification. Selling easier way and cheaper way to certificate. Makes confusion. People who adhere to ZWIA principles said they wanted to continue with ILZB. We don't know what's happening with our clients.

We called Global ZW to address this issue to restore calm to the market.

Transition has been rough. Don't have client base.

Ruth - what role is Matheus playing with GZW. Please provide updates in Brazil with regards to Matheus.

Alberto - know something. Our role is for any organization to apply our International Zero Waste Management Systems Standard.

Any consulting companies can implement it, and later as international assessing bodies as Icontec or OCA Global audit and certify. If Elena or Annemarie want to apply our standard they can do it because they have taken the GZW Course. Sandra is attending an international conference but is writing in the chat.

Gary: could you follow-up with Sandra to find out what is going on with Matheus in Brazil. National Affiliates have exclusivity in their countries. In Brazil, ILZB is the official certification body so if Matheus is working with GZW in Brazil it's ok, but he cannot certify as ZWIA. Costa Rica is working with TRUE yet this is different to what they do with ZWIA.

RUTH - We would like to learn about your relationship with Matheus in Brazil. If Matheus is not representing ZWIA there is no problem, yet this can cause confusion since he used to work with ILZB

Andre - Mateus is representing Global Zero Waste in Brazil.

Ruth - TRUE is also active in Brazil.

Mateus taking intellectual property from ILZB is between them.

Andre - Global ZW represents ZWIA in Colombia.

Ruth- they could represent

Andre - how do we check that? Checked the business proposal and the ZWIA logo is there. Has become a matter of semantics. If GZW and ILZB are both using ZWIA then this poses a problem. You cannot both be under the ZWIA umbrella.

RUth - this is incorrect. ZWIA cannot be referenced if Matheus is using the ZWIA logo. Based on what country National Affiliate is approved for.

Alberto - our certification is international, in other countries. Matheus was trained as an auditor of GZW.


Another thing is the ZW process. More clarity there is, the better. Those who certify standard. Mateus was trained in our standard like

Ruth - only conflict happens when certifying organization in multiple countries, and not coordinating with a National Affiliate. We informed Canada National Affiliate when a U.S. company with facilities also in Canada, wanted certification. There is only one national affiliate working with ZWIA.

Enzo - focused on technicalities. Andre mentioned a different approach to certification. Is that a different procedure, or what can be certified as ZW. Since we know Global ZW is certifying under ZWIA, they keep aligned with our principles and definitions. Is Mateus sticking to the real ZW definition?

Andre - He's accepting pallets for incineration and co-processing. Composting not needed any more. Easier way

Enzo - we already tackled this issue. Rodrigo shared it with Mateus. That's an easy one to stop. Whenever anyone Incineration is unacceptable. There's a lack of scientific basis to allow that. Already in Europe, incineration footprint is higher than average impacts of energy mix in Europe. Moving towards more renewables and away from fossil fuels. Shared screen. Incineration and coal produce the most CO2 per unit of energy (BBC, 2024, report). Incineration is dirtiest way to produce energy. We should be shifting the focus. Focus on how many grams/kgs CO2 emitted per unit.



Alberto - we have been operating in Latin American for 12 years. If any company in our standard is doing energy recovery or incineration, must reduce it and can't add it to deviation from final disposition. Especially for hazardous waste, the incineration of ordinary waste is not allowed. Alberto has implemented their system in 9 Latin American countries including Brazil 5 years ago and now in Spain.

Ruth - we recognize that they are not counted as Zero Waste. Some materials handled by landfill and incineration. That's conflict we had with Mateus - he was counting

destructive disposal as Zero Waste. To the extent that Global ZW is accepting incineration as part of Zero Waste, that would need to be clarified. TRUE is another platform. Global Zero Waste. Are you recognizing businesses that include incineration as Zero Waste.

Alberto - incineration is not Zero Waste.

Enzo - we are not Zero Waste to landfill. Thanks for that clarification Ruth.

We also discussed extensively with Certification Committee. Problem with legacy incinerators. Cappannori was compelled to use incinerator, but that does not count as diversion.

Problem is that there is still a leakage.

That is well defined in the circular economy definition of ZWIA.

Andre- is Global ZW under ZWIA in Colombia?

Alberto - We have been operating in Latin America and international operations (e.g. Spain) 12 years ago. The standard is the same for all the word, if Mateus or any consultancy companies are implementing the International Zero Waste Management System Standard of Global Zero Waste, they are aligned with ZWIA hierarchy, where energy recovery or incineration, must reduce it and can't add it to deviation from final disposition.

Ruth - Global ZW does not represent ZWIA in Brazil. They can say they follow the definition of ZW and don't recognize incineration in Zero Waste. They represent ZWIA in Colombia. There is only one National Affiliate in each country. If want to work in another country with a National Affiliate, must work together with the National Affiliate. It's collaborative.

Andre - what is the role of the National Affiliate?

Ruth - to implement ZWIA standards in their country. Your perceiving a competition between Global ZW and ILZB. Only competition if they are offering ZWIA certification in Brazil and not following our Guidelines. Plenty of businesses to be certified. We cooperated with Costa Rica in our recognition program with schools.

Andre - not cooperative in Brazil. Aggressive competition by Mateus. Using both ZWIA and GZB logos in his presentations in Brazil. O

Ruth - Cease and desist if you're not a national affiliate

Enzo - Something substantial - Mateus includes incineration in calculation of diversion. This is not Zero Waste. We can step in and say that's not Zero Waste and ask him to stop it. ILZB is a National Affiliate.

Alberto - if consultants apply GZW standard, they are aligned with ZWIA hierarchy. Will review cooperation and deadlines in the next meeting.

Gary - Go to ZWIA guidelines and use password protected: ZeroWaste

National Affiliates roles and responsibilities and how to collaborate. This was been working well for 20 years and we hope it continues. As came out in the discussion, the intellectual property issues btw Brazil and Matheus are more legal with lawyers. We are looking at our guidelines and intentions. We strive to working together collaboratively and hopefully the issues that came up will be resolved moving forward.

Gary - sent the powerpoint version of the PDF. If you could translate this would be great so I can act. I need your English translation in order to do something as soon as I get that. Rodrigo can join us at our next Board meeting.

Andre - will be at the next Board meeting.

Gary - Board meeting is open to GZW next Thursday (Feb 20) next week. Please add Colombia to the Board meeting listserve. His topic was zero waste and climate change. Has been working on a Sierra Club producer responsibility. Policy guideline has not been adopted yet, but he's been working on legislature for many years.

2. Zero Waste USA Presentation

Ruth – ZW USA is the National Affiliate for ZWIA in the USA. Provided short history for new members. 2013 –

US ZW Business Council founded in 2012, with Rick and Gary involved, that followed the ZWIA definition of Zero Waste and ZW business principles. In 2016, USZWBC integrated into Green Business Certification Inc. of the US Green Building Council. They rebranded themselves as TRUE Zero Waste. They proceeded outside our responsibility, but closely coordinate with Zero Waste USA. That system now has 749 projects . 365 Certifited Projects, Over 2476 TRUE Advisors worldwide in 33 countries and 47 states.

Zero Waste USA continues to provide a lower level opportunity, including a Road to Zero Waste Criteria, as TRUE doesn't fill all the needs of businesses and communities. We fill the gap. Shared criteria in PPT for those.

ZWIA has recognized Cities of Palo Alto, San Diego and Castro Valley Sanitary District. Last year, recognized Cox Enterprises as a ZW Business by Zero Waste USA. They provided data for all 71 facilities, that were certified by GreenCircle Certified. Cox is recognized international brand. We support GM in their support of ZW. They look to ZWIA and Zero Waste USA for ZW criteria. We have consultants that help get businesses and institutions getting on the road to ZW, and we support them. Have monthly dialogs for those pursuing ZW. We provide gravitas for those consultants to ensure they recognize ZW definition, Hierarchy and use ZWIA Recognition program criteria.

2. UN Zero Waste Definition and International Day of ZW 2025

The UN Zero Waste Advisory Board was appointed by the UN Secretary General last year for 2 year terms. Jamie Kaminski of the ZWIA Board of Directors contacted all members and received a favorable response from one of them. Neil Seldman reached out to the rep. from the U.S. (Saleem Ali,

Professor, Energy and Environment, University of Delaware, and Honorary Professor, Sustainable Resources Development, University of Queensland). Neil was able to connect by email with Saleem. Saleem suggested it would be good for ZWIA to participate in the next webinar they are organizing for end of January 2025 and copied staff at UNEP, so we now have a contact at the UNEP to communicate with. As Neil had a serious health problem in December, I followed up with the contact at the UNEP about ZWIA participation in the UNEP webinar this week, and he indicated that they had not selected the date and time yet for the webinar, but he was working on that and would get back in touch with us. In the email correspondence with UNEP, they also requested a case study to highlight on the UN ZW website. Ruth volunteered to write up a case study for UNEP of the San Diego, CA fix-it clinics based on a case study done by the USEPA recently on that.

Once we confirm ZWIA participation in the webinar, Rick, Ruth, Neil and I will work to identify how the Advisory Board came to be appointed, what has been discussed at meetings they've had, and how they would like to get input from stakeholders such as leaders of ZWIA, GAIA and ZWIA National Affiliates. We will also explore how we could get someone representing international Zero Waste leaders from ZWIA and/or GAIA on the ZW Advisory Board.

3. Zero Waste Hierarchy (Working Group and Board recommendations; Jamie)

Jamie – Latest update. All the changes asked for have been approved by the ZWIA Board at the last Board meeting. I then noticed that we already had a definition of Circular Economy, so we have 2 definitions of a Circular economy approved. Shared screen with email highlighting the 2 definitions. So now we have to decide on definition of Circular Economy. Jamie suggested a blended definition. Most of it is Ellen MacArthur Foundation language, then added some details at the end to clarify that a circular economy minimizes leakages of resources.

Gary – add "ZWIA" before Hierarchy. Reference what is language from EMF and provide a citation on that, and consider adding the correct butterfly diagram.

Elena – agree with Gary. Please read verbally as I just had eye operation and can't see it.

Chris – the original definition included the 2 types of cycles (biological and technical cycles). Leaving that in would help in guiding programs in the future.

Gary – I would use "biological nutrients" and "industrial feedstocks".

Chris – also talk about design being important. Both of these could be footnotes.

4. ZW and Circular Economy - ISO Standard for Circular Economy: https://www.iso.org/standard/80648.html;

U.S. <u>Save Our Seas 2.0</u> Circular Economy Definition:

"The term "circular economy" means an economy that uses a systems-focused approach and involves industrial processes and economic activities that—

- (A) are restorative or regenerative by design;
- (B) enable resources used in such processes and activities to maintain their highest values for as long as possible; and
- (C) aim for the elimination of waste through the superior design of materials, products, and systems (including business models)."

What does the Committee think about this Save our Seas 2.0 circular economy definition? Does it allow for incineration to be considered part of "circular economy"

Here are 2 Circular Economy definitions now being considered in ZWIA Hierarchy to compare:

Current ZWIA Definition:

Circular Economy

An industrial economy that is, by design or intention, restorative and in which material flows are of two types, biological nutrients, designed to re-enter the biosphere safely, and technical nutrients, which are designed to circulate at high quality without entering the biosphere. Materials are consistently reused rather

than wasted. All options that cause leakage or losses of material from their circular management (such as incineration, co-incineration, fuel production, fuel use, and the like) are not part of a Circular Economy system. Circular economy should be clearly defined to follow the Zero Waste Hierarchy and not show energy recovery as a process prior to landfilling.

New Proposed Definition:

Circular Economy:

The circular economy is a system where materials never become waste and nature is regenerated. In a circular economy, products and materials are kept in circulation through processes like maintenance, reuse, refurbishment, remanufacture, recycling, and composting. The circular economy addresses climate change and other global challenges, like biodiversity loss, waste, and pollution, by decoupling economic activity from the consumption of finite resources. A circular economy minimizes "leakages" of resources and therefore excludes options that are inherently linear such as incineration and landfilling.

5. ZWIA website Enquiry from Hong Kong Coca Cola for "Zero Waste to Landfill"

Gary followed up with email to Coca Cola to highlight our National Affiliate ZW Canada will respond, and that we focus on ZW, not ZW to landfill. Cc'd: Jamie to followup.

Rick – did some work in 2000 in Hong Kong. They had a Greenpeace movement there. We wrote a ZW Plan for Greenpeace. Posted on IISR website. Eric Lombardi said it was a good job.

6. Does ZW Brazil count the burning of pallets as part of calculating Zero Waste?

Rodrigo asked Mateus to send a report of what happened and to explain why it was done, and whether it was considered part of the 10% that's not Zero Waste. ZWIA has not received any such report. As a result, I sent the following email

this week to Rodrigo and Mateus to refrain from counting of burning of pallets as part of calculating Zero Waste:

Jamie- Did Rodrigo agree with ZWIA?

Ruth – just wanted to make sure our program is consistent. If National Affiliate wants to have something separate from ZWIA, that's OK. But the ILZB program included ZWIA logo.

Rick – don't we allow in the criteria, last 10% allows burning.

Jamie – yes, but doesn't count as diversion.

Ruth – That could be included in the 10%. That's not what ILZB did. They included burning of pallets as part of 90%

Rick – give them one more meeting to respond.

Jamie – don't know that we want a National Affiliate to set up their own program that accepts burning.

Ruth – they would do that in capacity as not ZWIA Affiliate. There are Affiliates with multiple programs. We don't say they have to exclusively implement.

Jamie – to be National Affiliate, have to agree to ZWIA definition of zero Waste. ZW Canada has its own program and follows ZWIA. HSR ZW helps on TRUE ZW. ZW Canada doesn't have anything to do with other HSR programs.

Gary – if someone wants to clarify ZWIA guidelines to address this issue about National Affiliates, let's agendize that for another meeting.

Rick – don't know why Brazil couldn't consider pallets in the last 10%
