

Camper Code of Conduct

At Pleasant Hill Outdoor Camp we want every camper to have the best week of summer possible; full of fun, learning, and growth. To ensure that we maintain a relationally safe environment and each camper is free to experience camp life to its fullest, we will not tolerate any behavior that takes that opportunity away from other campers. We will be addressing all incidents such as bullying and irresponsible behavior seriously and will train the staff to recognize and deal effectively with such behavior. Understanding that camp is for ALL campers, any behavior deemed by the camp to be outside of the camper code of conduct and/or unmanageable may result in any or all of the following:

- 1. A meeting with a staff member(s), the Camper Advocate, and/or Program/Executive Director
- 2. A natural consequence corresponding to the behavior, such as sitting out at an activity.
- 3. A telephone call home to the parent/guardian to discuss the behavior.
- 4. Being dismissed from the camp program and no refund will be processed.

As a camper I will:

Respect God

- be respectful of times that are dedicated to God (e.g. cabin devotion, chapel, prayer, etc.), if I wish not to participate I will observe quietly.
- communicate in an appropriate and God-honoring manner, which means I must not use foul, inappropriate language or gestures, violence, threats of any kind, harsh words, or tone of voice.
- be fully responsible for my actions and understand that irresponsible behavior will result in disciplinary action or dismissal from camp.

Respect Others

- show respect to all staff & campers, treat them kindly and how they would like to be treated
- listen to the camp staff by following and cooperating fully with their instructions
- refrain from deliberately causing bodily harm to other campers or staff. I understand that pushing, kicking, hitting, or fighting are not acceptable, and will not be tolerated.
- use uplifting language and not tease or participate in unkind behaviors.

Respect Property

- respect the property of others and camp by not stealing, intentionally causing property damage, vandalizing, or participating in unwelcomed breaches of privacy.
- not use camp supplies, property, or equipment without supervision & permission

Be Safe

- not intentionally cause harm to myself or others, this may result in immediate removal from camp.
- remember that personal relationships & physical displays of affection of a romantic nature are not allowed under any circumstances. I should not engage in or initiate any intimate or romantic relationship and behavior at camp. This includes but is not limited to flirtatious behavior, dating, intimate contact, and touch.
- follow the You+2 rule, I must always be in the presence of a staff member and another person.
- not bring inappropriate, illegal, or unsafe items. Bringing these items may result in confiscation, removal from camp, and/or appropriate legal action. See What to Bring & Not To Bring List
- Know & follow the rules of the camp
