Legislative Update

MSCA members are invited to participate in <u>monthly legislative update virtual discussions</u> (3rd Friday of each month during the legislative session). Here is what has been going on in the capitol:

• Key Legislation Passed:

- Control of the St. Louis Police Department, House Bill 495, has been passed, and the bill has been sent to the Governor.
- An omnibus utility bill, House Bill 567, has also been passed and sent to the Governor.

• Budgetary Issues:

- The FY2025 Supplemental Budget has been passed by the Senate and sent to the Governor.
- The House Budget Committee's work on the FY2026 budget was delayed due to problems with the new MOVERS accounting system.

• Controversial Debates:

- The Missouri Supreme Court heard arguments on a lawsuit seeking to strike down Proposition A, which concerns sick leave and minimum wage.
- Significant debate occurred on HB495 concerning Public Safety, and the St. Louis Police Department Control, with many amendments added.
- Debate also occurred on HB 567, modification of proposition A.

• Other Legislative Activity:

- Numerous other bills were debated and moved forward in both the House and Senate, covering a wide range of topics including education, healthcare, and taxation.
- Many committee hearings were held.
