1st Trimester Family Conferences:

Believe it or not, it's that time of year already! Next week, we will hold Family conferences with teachers Wednesday, and Friday (during the asynchronous learning day)

Family conferences are an amazing way to continue building relationships and partnerships with your child's teacher. It also serves as a way to stay updated regarding your child's academic and social emotional progress.

Here's how you can make the most out of your conference:

Before:

- Check in with kids about how they're doing on homework and in each subject. Review homework and any recent projects, tests, quizzes, feedback from teachers, etc.
- Ask if there are questions or issues your child wants you to discuss with the teacher.
 - Plan to bring something to take notes with (paper and pen or a laptop or other device **During:**
- Share a few things about your child with the teacher interests, strengths, favorite subjects — to help the teacher know your child better.
- Make a plan to check in regularly if there are any learning or behavior problems
- Ask about your child's work habits, independently and in large- and small-group instruction
- Ask how your child gets along with other students in class and during lunch, recess, and other classes.

 After:
- Contact the teacher with any questions you didn't have time to ask.
- Review your notes about what you and the teacher will do to support learning, then make detailed plans about how and when you will help your child.
- Check in with the teacher to follow up on your child's progress

Fire Drills, Safe Space Drill, and Shelter in Place- What does this mean?

Fire Drills

This drill is practiced several times a year to be sure everyone in the building knows how to get outside quickly and quietly. These drills may be scheduled and announced in advance so

that children can dress appropriately. There will be unannounced fire drills that are conducted by the fire department. Students are familiar with the sound of this alarm.

Safe Space Drills

This drill is designed as a response to an unexpected intruder or unidentified person in the school building as well as severe weather drills. For the safety of all students, this drill requires students to be inside their classrooms and out of sight of all doors, and entrances. In short, students sit along a wall, out of sight from the door and windows (when applicable). During this time, students are asked to remain quiet.

We use the language that they are going to their safe spaces. To help explain in developmentally-appropriate ways, language that seems to work with the little ones is that sometimes we leave the building in order to be safe and sometimes we stay in our classrooms.

Shelter in Place

This drill requires students to stay indoors. This drill typically happens if there is potential danger outside of the building or in the surrounding neighborhood. Students are able to move around normally inside, but outdoor recess, p.e., and other outdoor events will be on hold.

Grades K-3 ELA **Heggerty**

- Phonemic Awareness and Phonics curriculum intended for direct instruction around letter and sound recognition, and language awareness
- Program provides daily lessons that take about 10-15 minutes to work on skills over the course of a week or a few weeks, allowing students to engage with words following patterns and understanding word parts
- Teachers use resources such as letter or sound cards, hand motions, and online videos to engage all learners in the activities around blending, segmenting, substituting and more

Grades 4-8 ELA Amplify

- Digital and print material based on english/language arts standards
- Curriculum provides opportunities for students needing differentiation to access grade level content and extension for students needing higher academic rigor

- Hand 2 Mind guided math kits are structured as 9 units per grade, 20 lessons per unit covering the entire school year
- The kits includes are designed as lessons for the workshop model (which aligns to our CN way of teaching), along with ready to learn resources including task cards, activities, and independent work
- Correlated to the CCSS for data and instructional purposes
