Well, once again, iøkwe (hello)! And first of all, we want to thank God our father above in heaven for this good time for us to come together and learn together. And at this time now, we are in week 7, and the lesson for week 7 is learning about the Lord's prayer or the prayer of Jesus. And we know and understand that church culture has become part of our culture or integrated as part of our customs, from the year that the word of God came to this country of ours. And this is another way or another thing that is very important, as you are a Marshallese child, it's important for you to know the Lord's prayer. And in this prayer that I wrote down, it is from the first translation (of the Marshallese bible) for us to get used to it and learn from it because we are used to the newer translation today (of the Marshallese bible). All of the verses are there, but before I get started, I want to make something clear. When you open your bible up to the book of Matthew, or we say *Matu*, start in chapter 9 and go down to verse 13, that is where you will see the prayer of Jesus, where he promised them and said this is how we pray. And he

explained this prayer to the people of that time. And he taught them in his time period. And to make it more clear to us that this prayer is part of our culture these days that we are sending to you all and teaching us all, from time to time, because you are a child of the Marshalls who should know this prayer. And you should know this and know how to recite it from time to time. And this is no different, we will go forward and, uh, we will quote it, line for line, or verse for verse, and under the title of “the prayer of Jesus.”

Our Father who is in heaven, hallowed (Holy) be Your name;

Your kingdom come; Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread;

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us;

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For Yours is the kingdom, and the power and the glory forever.

AMEN.

Well, there you go, that is the prayer of Jesus and I believe this is very important for us to know this and also since we are Marshallese children. Because this prayer, as well as the bible, and living as a Christian are part of our culture from the beginning of the Word and its movement here. And we consider this to be a part of our culture today and it is very important for all of us to know the Lord’s prayer. Well, there you go, that’s the lesson for week 7, the prayer of Jesus.

And please learn this on your own, and increase your understanding and and get used to using this because it shows who we are according to our culture. Until next week, if it is God's will and everything is good, we will be with you all in another video. And it will tie together with those week's lessons. God be with us and protect our lives.
