- Wes didn't understand why his mom was so mad at him when he hit his sister (5). He was only three years old.
- His mom had such an abusive relationship before Wes's father. Which was Nikki's dad, his name is Bill.
- "But his addiction just got worse, and the physical, mental, and emotional abuse he unleashed became more intense". (9)
- "He grabbed her by her T-shirt and hair and started to drag her toward the kitchen". (10)
- "Her voice collected as she made her promise: "If you try that shit again, I will kill you." (10)
- Wes was furious when she found that someone punch his sister in the nose and she didn't fight back.(78)

The second Wes:

- "He was genuinely happy for Woody, but he was also deeply envious". (30).
- "Wes was heartbroken when Tony was shot in the chest during a botched drug deal." (57)
- "Wes spent his thirty-second birthday in prison.". (76)
- "Tony grabbed Wes shirt collar and him close, How many times do I have to tell you to leave this stuff alone man? His tone was low and serious, but he barked his words out like a challenge as two boys squared off." (72)

- In the B&K book, they are talking about how young adolescents start to identify their background. They start to want to know more about their background. (45) That what Wes did at first he didn't understand why his mom was so mad when he hit his sister. As years went on and his dad told him what happened to his mom before he did. Wes started to understand what was going on.

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The second Wes

- "Wes always felt he was smarter than the other kids in class and that the work just didn't hold his interest". (30)
 - "Wes didn't act up in class, which kept him under the radar, his teacher spent 90 percent of their time dealing with the 5 percent of kids who did". (30)

- "If someone disrespects you, you send a message so fierce that they won't have the chance to do it again. (33)
 - "Wes's left hand to his right, where he held a long-bladed knife". (33)
 - "Wes failed sixth grade at "Chicken Pen" and had to repeat it." (57)
 - "Wes was thinking he could earn some extra cash just wearing a headset. He not really selling drugs".(67)

- "I was excited to live with them, they were going to spoiled them like crazy". (37)
- "But I was

- In the B&K book, young adolescents PFC the brain to help them make decisions that impact their behavior(27) and that is the same with the other Wes in school. He felt like he was fine as long as he didn't get in trouble.
- Also, B&K talks about how their brain cells are increasing and they start to process information effectively.(26) In the book Wes was trying to figure out what he should do since a boy punched him in the face. He remembered what his brother told him and he made a decision on his own and that almost cost someone life. He didn't know what he was doing, he was just doing it out of anger
- Once both Wes started to reflect about what they are doing, they started to double think their decision. In the book metacognition helps young adolescents to reflect about what they have done and how they can fix it.

- Justin and Wes knew the rules: (52)
 - Never look people in the eye
 - Don't smile, it makes you look weak
 - If someone yells for you, particularly after dark, just keep walking.
 - Always keep your money in your front pocket, never back pocket.

There was a lot going on, only one of the Wes was successful, the other Wes got involved in the wrong things and is in jail for the rest of his life. If he was in a different environment he would have made it, and if he had successful people. That's why teachers have a very important role in children's lives. If Wes' teacher wasn't so focused on the kids that disrupted the classroom, Wes would have focused more in class and really would have been successful. He would have skipped class. Sometimes it's hard for teacher to balance all their students however don't put all your time into students that is distracting the class.
