Introduction \rightarrow *Heading Level* 1 (11 pts)

Introduction section firstly highlighted the target population, explaining the context in which the target population takes shelter while discussing the facts or phenomena in the target population that are the reasons for implementing community empowerment activities. In strengthening the background of the study or activity, authors are required to add empirical backgrounds and conceptual frameworks/backgrounds that are constructed from reviews of relevant previous studies which are published no later than 5 years. Things that have been done by other parties to overcome the problem are therefore mentioned.

Theoretical background as the next part contains previous theories as the basis of research and the temporary hypothesis. This theory will be used to provide state of the art of your

manuscript from research problems that have been proposed. In the context of community engagement, the theory that should be used primarily is the theory related to community engagement, community development, or community services. The last part, namely research objective and target of community empowerment activities, are related to expected social changes or community service goals.

Method \rightarrow *Heading Level* 1 (11 pts)

The method must clear with the location and time of the research, the population and sample of the research, the research variables and the research data. The method or strategy should be related to the research approach, for example: PAR (Participatory Action Research); ABCD (Asset Based Community Development); CBPR (Community-Based Participation Research); Service learning (SL); and or other Community Development Methods). In this section, Authors are required to justify the condition/situation before the programs/activities are implemented and the expected result which is depending on your field or the topic of community engagement program (program that has been done, experiment, impact of your program, survey, interview, questionnaire, etc.).

Result and Discussion \rightarrow *Heading Level* 1 (11 pts)

Contains a description of the results of the community service process, namely an explanation of the dynamics of assistance process (a variety of carried out activities, forms of technical action or program action to solve community problems). It also explains the emergence of expected social changes, for example the emergence of new institutions, changes in behavior, the emergence of local leaders (local leaders), and the creation of new awareness towards social transformation, and so on.

In this section, Authors are required to emphasize the analysis of the condition before and after the programs/activities of community engagement are implemented. The analysis should be completed with a further discussion on the participation of the community as well as the impacts that are gained by the community. It will be good additional content if the Authors also include the adoption of innovation by the community.

Result and discussion of your manuscript also interconnected with your theory that used, included novelty of your manuscript about community engagement. Also, your manuscript is based on the result of your community engagement program and what is the implication of this community engagement program to community. Minimum of your explanation on this chapter is range 40% to 50% of your manuscript.

1.1. Tables - Cambria, Italic, 11pt

All tables for submitting manuscript should be numbered with Arabic numerals and this tables can be edit and not as images. Every table should have a caption. Headings should be placed above tables, centered. Only horizontal lines should be used within a table, to distinguish the column headings from the body of the table, and immediately above and below the table.

Tables must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. If the table get on other sources, write the name of source below the table, left justified. Below is an example which the authors may find useful.

1.2. Figures Cambria, Italic, 11pt

Line drawings should be good quality scans or true electronic output. Low-quality scans are not acceptable. Figures must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. In MS word input the figures must be properly coded. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the caption or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper.

References of your manuscript must be up to date (in the last of 5 to 10 years and minimum of 20 references that 25% of the references is from primary sources/journal) and your reference can be accessed by anyone.
