

Tips for Cultivating
Empathy

Tip #1: Have conversations about seeing kindness and being kind. Ask your student, "Did you notice anyone being nice to someone else today?" followed by, "How were you kind to someone today?".

Tip #2: Kickstart a family kindness campaign. Do one kind thing for someone each day--this can be inside the home, for a neighbor, or for the community. If you're not sure where to start, try the Make Kindness the Norm Challenge.
