Measuring progress for individual students

MAPP Progress Judgements

Navigator

Typically to measure in-year progress :

- 75%+ of targets secure = good progress
- 90%+ of targets secure = outstanding progress

P-Step Progress Judgements

Explorer and Adventurer

Typically to measure in-year progress:

- 1 sub level achieved over one year = good progress
- 2 sub levels achieved over one year = outstanding progress

16+ Case Study Progress Judgements

Typically to measure in-year progress:

- 90% of qualifications achieved/likely to be achieved = good progress
- 100% of qualifications achieved/likely to be achieved = outstanding progress

Measuring progress for groups of students and as a whole school

How is good progress judged for groups of students?

If **75%+** of students are making expected (good) or above expected (outstanding) progress – this is good.

How is outstanding progress judged for groups of students?

If **90%+** of students are making expected (good) or above expected (outstanding) progress – this is outstanding.

If **85%** of students are making expected (good) progress with **55%+** making above expected progress this is also outstanding.

Remember - Not one size fits all!

This is not a fixed methodology of judging progress and a small proportion of students (2%-3%) with complex and profound needs have **adjustments made within these criteria.**
