Actors playing Men - Black dress shoes

Orphans-

Boots or Canvas shoes (ie off brand converse)

Hooverville Ensemble-

Playing a man: long sleeve button up shirt, black pants, belt

Playing a woman: Neutral color shirt/top

Wide legged denim jeans (or black pants)

All: Canvas or sneaker shoe

Mansion Staff:

Playing a man: black dress shoes, white dress shirt, black dress pants, black socks

Playing a woman: long sleeve long black dress (EXCEPT Mrs. Greer, Mrs. Pugh, Annette, and Cecile)

NYC Ensemble -
Same as Hooverville

NBC Radio Staff-
Bert Healy, Fred McCracken, and Jimmy Johnson - Button up shirt, dress pants, belt, black socks, dress shoes.

Sound effects person - wear whatever you think is best, Evan

Cabinet Members -

Playing a man (everyone but Lillian) - white button up shirt, dress pants, belt, black socks, black dress shoes

Playing a woman (Lillian) - White button up shirt, tan character shoes.
