

Terry Fox was a young man from British Columbia, Canada. At the age of 18 he was diagnosed with bone cancer and had to have his right leg amputated six inches above his knee. While in hospital in 1980, Terry was so overcome by the suffering of cancer patients that he decided to run across Canada to fundraise for cancer research.

With one leg having been amputated, he embarked on a cross-Canada run to raise money and awareness for cancer research. His run became known as the Marathon of Hope. Although the spread of his cancer eventually forced him to end his quest after 143 days and 5,373 km, and ultimately cost him his life, his efforts resulted in a lasting, worldwide legacy: the **Terry Fox Run**.

The Terry Fox Run is a non-competitive event (run, jog, or walk) to raise funds to support the research towards a cure for cancer. It is the world's largest one-day event and happens all across the world.

All filled out pledge/donation sheets and the money raised should be handed to the advisory teachers or brought to the Service Learning working space (#410) but can also be returned on Saturday during the event. There will be a donation table near the Atrium.

"I'm not a dreamer, and I'm not saying this will initiate any kind of definitive answer or cure to cancer, but I believe in miracles. I have to. I just wish people would realize that anything is possible if they try; dreams are made if people try." - Terry Fox
