 - i. Space issues for many of our schools
 - ii. Accessibility limitations and requirements
 - iii. Age, wear and tear, maintenance
 - h. High Level Plan Information:
 - i. Third party vendors were used to determine growth and capacity.
 - i. Options:
 - i. Multiple options were reviewed (three vs four school options).
 - ii. Plan that was landed represents the greatest consolidation but also to take traffic, site views, neighborhood capacity etc. into account.
 - j. Renovation vs Replace:
 - i. Per the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission when renovation exceeds more than 67% replacement cost, replacement is recommended.
 1. Chapman: 74%
 2. Surrarrer: 74%
 3. Muraski: 77%
 4. Whitney: 83%

- k. Ballot Issue:
 - i. 3 new construction K-5 schools at Albion, Chapman, and Surrarrer properties with approximately 700 students each
 - ii. Renovation and expansion of Muraski as a centralized preschool unifying the preschool classrooms at Lunn Road and Chapman ES.
 - iii. Renovation of Kisner Elementary
 - 1. Will accommodate approximately 500 students.
- l. Bond Issue Overview:
 - i. \$147,650,000 school improvement bond issue which is 10.5 million reductions in Bond request due to strong financial stewardship.
 - ii. Estimated millage: 3.43 mills.
 - iii. Approximate Cost: \$120 per \$100,000 of appraised property value annually (\$1 a day)
 - iv. Repayment period is 36 years.
 - v. Bond funds will be restricted to construction, renovation, site work, and infrastructure. It cannot be used for salaries, supplies, or operating expenses.
- m. Questions:
 - i. What is the current enrollment for K-5? Approximately 3,000
Projected: Next ten years for all grades is approximately 6500
(current all grades: 5600)
 - ii. What is going to happen to Whitney? Whitney will be demolished and abated. The school will be maintaining this site and plans for it to be used for the youth/sports. The Whitney site will stay under ownership of SCS. Most likely will be used for youth practice fields. Any sort of repurpose of the actual school is not in the plans. Upkeep will be maintained by the school district.
 - iii. What about the administration building? The current location has a longer lifespan than Whitney. The administrative offices will stay there for the near future.
 - iv. Technology: Any technology that can be moved and has a usable life will be used at the new school, not thrown away.
 - v. If the bond fails what is plan b? Address why the bond failed and then adjust where necessary. If it were the plan, they would look at the plan, if it's the dollars, they will look at that.
 - vi. Will operational costs on new buildings be lower than the current operational costs? Yes, they will.
