The Future - El Futuro

Tenemos 4 maneras de expresar el futuro dependiendo del punto de vista del hablante:

1. Present simple:

Usamos el presente simple cuando se trata de una actividad fija y el horario es inamovible. Por ejemplo, una clase o la salida de un avión: *"the class starts at 7"*, *"The plane leaves at 10:10"*

2. Will +infinitive:

Este modal puede usarse en tres contextos diferentes. Por un lado lo usamos para decisiones espontáneas: The telephone rings *"I'll answer it"*

En Segundo lugar lo usamos para sentenciar promesas o amenazas: *"I'll kill you"* *"will you marry me?"*

Y por último, lo usamos para hacer predicciones cuando no tenemos evidencia: *"He'll come"* (*but I'm not sure*)

3. Be- going-to-infinitive: (gonna)

Al igual que WILL se usa para predicciones pero estas tienen que tener sí o sí algún tipo de evidencia. *"Look at the sky; it is going to rain soon"*

También lo usamos para mostrar que tenemos la intención de hacer algo (quizás, no se llegue a concretar) *"I'm going to visit my grandma soon"*

4. Present continuous:

Lo usamos para cuando acordamos un plan con alguien. *"I'm visiting my grandma tomorrow."*
