- <u>Student Visa:</u> Those who have enrolled in a university for higher studies will get this one.
- <u>D1 Visa:</u> You are eligible for this visa only if you have got a job in an institute or company in Portugal.
- Residential Visa: If you have plans to live and work in Portugal, this visa will be a perfect choice for you. To be eligible for it, you need to give proof that you are stable financially and have enough money to survive independently. Alternatively, you must have a job in this country. Your health insurance is also required.
- Retirement Visa: Persons aged 55 or above can get this visa if they have enough income or savings like pension or gratuity amount.
