All material on LISSA is automatically associated with a Project (submission content) on the [Open Science Framework](#). If your materials are already on the Open Science Framework, you can submit to LISSA specifically in the submission process (submit here: <https://osf.io/preprints/lissa/submit>). Submitters can attach additional materials to their work by including them in the associated project. Materials submitted are covered by the COS's [terms of use](#) except when covered by our own license (see specifically Section 6, Privacy Settings Restricting Access to Content).
