## Apps, Al and Other Useful Tools

- Al for Educators:
  - Aligning Al for Multilingual Learners: Integrating the WIDA Standards Framework into Prompts (Webinar)

- <u>ChatGPT</u> Educators use it for translating, embedding key word supports, simplifying, summarizing, and more.
- <u>Diffit for Teachers</u> site that uses AI to differentiate a lesson into different grade levels and languages. This <u>video</u> explains how to use it for multilingual learners.
- Magic School.
- To add images to a text, download the <u>SlidesAl</u> extension to Google Slides, and input your text.
- To create images, Microsoft <u>Free Al Image Generator</u>.
- Padlet (and Sandbox) includes Al-generated images.
- Suggestions on how to write AI prompts to create images.
- Pictures to help with communicating with newcomers:

### **Creating Welcoming Schools & Engaging with Families**
