# **Policy Framework**

#### Goals guiding our work

- 1. Achieve universal health care in WA State and our nation
- 2. Improve health care affordability and access, while driving down escalating industry profits and controlling prices
- 3. Advance equity and address social determinants of health, with a particular focus on reducing racial disparities
- 4. Defend access to health care through existing public programs, including staving off privatization and monopolization in our current healthcare system, while working toward a universal health care system

### Criteria we use when "filtering" specific bills/budget items

- Does the issue enhance and support the mission and goals of HCHR? (With specific reference to at least one of HCHR Goals #1-4 above)
- Does the issue have a critical mass of advocates, including a core leadership of organizations within HCHR?
- Is there a clear and realistic strategy to pass or adopt the policy proposal?

## 2025 Legislative Agenda

The 2025 platform may continue to be refined in alignment with our goals and filtering criteria as the state legislative session and Congress reconvene in 2025. Policy items may meet more than one of HCHR's four goals, but are listed once for simplicity. More details can be found in our <u>filtering document</u> and <u>meeting log</u>.
