

REMARKS OF PRESIDENT GUNNZ011 - AS PREPARED FOR DELIVERY
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My fellow Americans, thank you.

I stand here on this very ground that Presidents Lincoln and Roosevelt stood on not with an urgency to rally the masses as those Presidents did during times of crisis, but with the realization that the American experiment has succeeded once again. The peaceful transition of power is miraculous in other nations; here, it is a testament to the enduring stability of the republic.

Our thanks must go out to President GuiltyAir, who served this nation with honor and dignity. And we must thank Vice President Hurricaneoflies, who ran a truthful yet passionate campaign that was honorable up to the very end. But today, the campaign is over, and now begins the difficult national duty of setting this nation on a path to success.

Today, we embark on a new journey for America; one that is progressive in philosophy yet respectful of time-honored traditions. We must not embark on this journey alone, for we are accompanied by men and women that share a predilection for different policy but otherwise believe in the same fundamental principles. This Presidency will be one that serves every single citizen of the United States.

E pluribus unum: from many, one. The founding motto of this nation that rings true to this very day. The miracle of America. That no matter your background, no matter where you live or come from, your religious beliefs, your culture, your language, or your job, that we can all come together to work towards a more perfect union. I believe that this nation is special, more than the sum of its parts and that the ideals we hold as Americans that have made us the strongest and most prosperous country in the world will continue to abide for generations. No longer shall our government act in its own self-serving interests, with a few reaping the rewards while the American people bear the cost. I look forward to these challenges knowing that we can only come up with solutions if we govern by consensus, and not if we govern by partisan fiat. Throughout the history of this nation, our greatest accomplishments were those where people of different creeds and consortiums collaborated in good faith

for genuine change. I know that my Presidency too will be no exception and I will work with defenders and detractors alike to ignite genuine change in this country.

This election wasn't about the size of our government, but whether our government works for the citizens it professes to serve. Americans want great schools for their children, safe neighborhoods for their families, and good jobs for themselves. Valid demands of citizens for their government. Yet many are trapped in poverty, failed by our education system, and robbed by crime and drugs that have ruined so many lives. This plague on America stops here and now. Where the government is working, we will move forward. Where the government is failing, we will make a change. Where there is waste and inefficiency, we will make cuts. I support much needed criminal justice reform to a system that has for so long failed those who need help the most. I plan to transform our prisons into places of rehabilitation, not punishment. We should be creating opportunities for those incarcerated to become productive members of society, not castigating them as criminals and sentencing them to lives of crime. As a part of this plan, I will reduce sentences for nonviolent drug offenses, like simply possessing drugs. Drug addicts are victims, not criminals. I also want better protections and training in place for our police officers. These brave men and women have to deal with the worst part of society on a daily basis, that many of us never even see. I am an advocate for body cameras for all police officers for everyone's protection, and thorough training so that our police officers are properly equipped in every situation they encounter.

I support education reform that puts students first. I believe that we should put an end to failing practices of constant, unrelenting standardized testing that reduces students to a number on a page, and mountains of homework that discourage students from learning. I believe in empowering America's young minds to face the next big challenges the world has to offer. I support reform that places states and local school districts in charge of curriculum. They know more about the needs of their students than the federal government. The policies of common core have failed our students and our nation, and we need a change that puts parents and students first.

I will work towards an economy that serves all Americans. A prosperous economy that offers a job for every American. An economy that rebuilds our middle class. An economy that gives the poorest Americans a chance to better their lives and break the destructive cycle of poverty. An economy in which everyone is free and able to pursue the American dream that with enough hard work and determination, you might make a better life for your children and your children's children. Right now our government robs Americans of their hard-earned money. Taxing us too much while at the same time spending our tax dollars unwisely. Our government is a glutton in dire need of a diet. My administration will propose a tax plan that will give this nation a flat tax rate of 15% with those that make less than \$50,000 not having to pay a dime in income taxes so that we have a tax plan that is simple and fair for all Americans. Americans are punished for their debts but politicians in Washington are rewarded for spending beyond their means. My administration has a plan to cut wasteful spending across the board and bring a balanced budget to Congress because trying to cut taxes without cutting spending is like trying to fill a bucket without patching the holes.

For too long, our southern border has been a source of many great problems. Illegal drugs are smuggled through our southern border, destroying the lives of so many great Americans and eliciting crime and carnage in the streets of our great cities. Criminal organizations engage in human trafficking unchecked through our unsecured southern border. We as a nation have a moral responsibility to end this humanitarian crisis and secure our country. We will make sure that our great men and women of the border patrol have the resources they need to combat these great problems. Along with securing our southern border, I propose a system of merit-based immigration, so that we attract the best and brightest immigrants to this country to better our collective future.

I stand here today ready to repair any of our foreign relations that have fallen into neglect. I believe that we as a nation are stronger through sturdy alliances and enduring convictions to our allies. I believe that isolationism will not prosper us and that we as a nation have a duty to advocate for the ideals of freedom and self-determination across the world. However, I do not believe America needs to police the world or meddle in the affairs of other countries. And we shouldn't use our military forces at the behest of the interests of another nation. That is why I will bring most of our troops home from the Middle East and Africa. No longer will the blood of Americans be spilled for causes that don't benefit us, and in countries that aren't a threat to our collective security.

I believe that your children and your children's children have a right to grow up in a healthy and safe America. Climate change is a real issue facing the world today and I believe it to be one of the most important issues that we need to work to solve. However, I will not support vacuous, ineffectual policies that harm our economy, drain businesses of their money, and wreak unemployment. Rather, I propose a market solution, so that businesses are incentivized to fight climate change and make our environment safer and healthier for all Americans.

No problem is too big, and no challenge is too daunting for us to solve if we face it as a nation in unity. If we come together in love, not hatred, in patriotism, not prejudice, we can move forward, make real change, and accomplish anything we set our minds to. To every American, near and far, from sea to shining sea, I say this: It's your voice, your hopes, and your dreams that will define our destiny. Your courage and goodness and love will forever guide us along the way.
