This course introduces the student to the language and culture of France and other French speaking countries. The content includes beginning skills in listening and speaking with special attention to pronunciation. The fundamentals of grammar will be taught with basic reading and writing. Vocabularies for greetings, time, dates, family, food, clothing, household and classroom items will be learned in thematic units. Emphasis will be on the core skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing. Students will also learn about the culture of French speaking countries around the world.

Students will be using the textbook in class as well as workbook and additional practice activities. The students are expected to keep a notebook with all French notes taken in class and all handouts and work given in chronological order. Homework will be activities taken from the text, workbook and additional handouts. Grading will be done on the following materials using individual points for each assignment:
