- I. **Objectives:** At the completion of this unit, students should...
 - A. Have completed the process of writing College Application essays or Job App Cover Letters with a Financial Planning Guide (for non-college bound students)
 - B. Be able to show an understanding of the Code of Chivalry as conveyed in literature and to identify its modern application in how we live our lives and interact with other people
 - C. Be able to show connections between literature and students' own lives

II. Syllabus: The following is tentative and subject to change. Remember that anything on the syllabus is considered preannounced and students are to be ready with assignments despite absences. The syllabus does not reflect all daily "openers" or "Quick Writes" which, when collected, may count as a grade or sometimes as extra credit.
