What is a SoWA? A quote from the Bible, Catechism, a Saint or Doctor of the Church, the Torah, Tenakh etc - remember you need to be accurate and specific - "for example when Jesus healed someone" is not good enough, but "for example when Jesus healed Jairus' daughter" is sufficient. If you can add at least the book, that is useful to show the examiner you know your stuff!
