Course Description/Student Learning Outcomes:

Painting I introduces students to the fundamentals of painting and mixed media. The course will cover various painting skills, elements of art, principles of design, and art history relevant to each project. The course emphasizes technical skills, use of painting and mixed media knowledge, creative development, and analysis of aesthetic images. Some projects include 3D forms still life (learning value, form and lighting), Color Theory Pop Art painting (learning color harmonies and the history and style of Pop Art), watercolor landscape (learning watercolor techniques and atmospheric perspective), and the surrealist perspective painting (learning the history and style of surrealism and the accurate use of 1pt and 2pt perspective).

The course will take a thematic approach in regards to skills, ideas, and subject matters. There will be lectures, demonstrations, discussions, slide presentations, studio work, student group work, and individual oral and written critiques/presentations. Group discussions of projects will enable students to articulate concepts using art vocabulary.

Students MUST come to class daily for the sole purpose of improving their painting skills and to be able to have access to studio work time in the classroom to work on their painting projects and assignments.

Students will create original works inspired by themselves, their peers, and their environment. Students will learn to use techniques taken from history ranging from impressionism to contemporary. At the end of the year, Students will have a full portfolio of original works, an overview of the medium's history, and a working repertoire of vocabulary and working techniques.

By end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Produce paintings which demonstrate creativity, painting & mixed media skills, art concepts, art elements, and principles of design.
- 2. Use painting and visual analysis to communicate ideas, thoughts, and feelings.
- 3. Analyze artworks.
- 4. Work in studio style classroom sessions.
- 5. Do oral and written critiques.
- 6. Do research projects in art history involving painting.

Assessment and Grading (BP 5121 / AR 5121): To ensure that every student has an equal opportunity to demonstrate their learning, the course instructors implement aligned grading practices and common assessments with the same frequency.

- 1. **Grading categories and their percentage weights**: Non-weighted systems will be used. All assessment components are point based. Projects, critiques, proposals, artist statements are varied in points. The points will be added at the end of each semester for a letter grade.
- 2. Achievement evidence collected within each grading category: Students will be informed of the aligned quantity, weight, and due dates of assignments/assessments in each grading category as much in advance as possible.
- 3. **Grading scales:** 100% =A+, 99.99%-92.50% = A, 92.49%-90%=A-, 89.99%-87.50%=B+, 87.49%-82.50%=B, 82.49%-80%=B-, 79.99%-77.50%=C+, 77.49%-72.50%=C, 72.49%-70%=C-, 69.99%-67.50=D+, 67.49%-62.50%=D, 62.49%-60.00=D-, 59.99%-0.00=F
- **4.** Homework/outside of class practices (AR 6154): Students may need to take some work home in order to complete by the deadline, however regular homework is not assigned. All work can be completed during class time.
- **5. Excused absence make-up practices** (<u>Education Code 48205(b)</u>): Make-up work will be assigned on an individual basis. Students must make contact with the teacher to make necessary arrangements for make-up work. It is the students' responsibility to determine missing assignments.
