

Facts about Mathema's Flag



It took weeks for King Francis I to design the flag. It was a long process, but the king said that wait was worth it, and it was. Blue was chosen for the background because it is his highness favorite color and represents the sky. As the old saying goes, "the sky's the limit," which means that there's no limit to pursue your goal. The yellow circle inside the black border resembles the sun, helping us light the way. The symbol inside the circle represents the number pi. His highness chose pi because it is one of the most known and exciting numbers. Pi is drawn with two straight vertical boxes and 1 straight horizontal box (looks like a 2D table).

Mathema's Flag code

1. The Flag should never flown upside down except as a signal for distress.
2. The Flag should never touch the ground, and cannot be carried horizontally (always aloft)
3. The flag should never be used as clothing, or napkin, or anything disposable like the Americans do during their independence day
4. The flag may be flown halfway as a sign of respect for someone's death.
5. The flag must be displayed from sunrise until sunset, except during bad weather.
6. If the flag is in poor conditions, one must disposed of it in a ceremonial way, preferably by burning
