Wildcat Family,

Greetings to FHS Families! You are receiving the 1st FHS Parent and Family Weekly Update of the 2021-2022 school year! This update is for the week of August 16th, 2021. We typically send these out on Friday's, and they include lots of valuable information to keep parents and families in the know about anything and everything happening at FHS. FHS/FJHS Joint Campus

For the next two years due to construction throughout the district, our campus will house grades 7-12. Grades 9-12 will be in the high school building, and grades 7-8 will be in a modular campus located behind the high school. Adding two grade levels to our campus will deeply impact student arrival and dismissal. When we start on August 16th, grades 7 and 8 will be attending remotely. We anticipate them to begin attending in-person around Labor Day. Please look for updates on arrival and dismissal protocols as we transition to supporting grades 7-12 on one campus. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

A Day in the Life at Franklin High School:

We can't wait to welcome students on Monday August 16th. To help make the start of school less stressful, we have included information about what a "typical" day looks like at FHS.

- FHS Main Office Hours: FHS Office Hours are Monday-Friday 7am-3pm
- Covid-19 Protocols:
 - o Masks: At this time, masks are optional in the school building.
 - Per federal mandates, masks are mandatory on school busses, regardless if someone is vaccinated.
 - o FCS 21-22 Reopening Framework
 - Warren County Health Dept. Guidelines as of 8/9/21
- Arrival: We will open the doors for students daily at 7:15am. If students arrive before 7:15am, they will not be permitted in the building until 7:15am. Once they enter the building, they can go get breakfast or report to the appropriate designated location.
- Where to Report Day One: For the first day, all students will start the day in their Advisory. Advisories will be posted throughout the building. Once they get to Advisory, they will receive an updated copy of their schedule. After the first day,

students will start their day by reporting to their 1st period.

• School Hours: Our school day runs from 7:30am-2:35pm.

- <u>Tardy Bell:</u> The tardy bell rings to start the day at 7:30am. Typically, students will start their day in 1st period unless we are running a modified schedule.
- Breakfast: Breakfast will be served daily in the cafeteria from 7:15am-7:30am.
- <u>Dismissal:</u> Buses typically pull out of our parking lot by 2:40/2:45pm. Only students staying for clubs, athletics and/or tutoring will be permitted to be in the building past 2:45 pm. We will clear the lobby daily at 2:45pm.

• <u>Updated Schedules:</u> All students will receive an updated schedule on Monday, August 16th. These may be different from what they received in June, and they

must follow the one they receive on the 1st day.

- <u>Student Drivers</u>: All students who drive to school MUST park in the back parking lot. We will start selling and issuing Parking Passes the week of August 23rd. Student drivers will NOT be permitted to leave the parking lot until all buses have left property. To start the year, all students are to park in the back lot. This may change once the JH Modular campus opens after Labor Day.

GUIDANCE UPDATE

Monday, August 9, 2021

Please encourage your student to check their Franklin email on a daily basis. Important information is relayed to them via email and we don't want them to miss any opportunities.

<u>Schedules</u>: Students will start the day in Advisory on Monday, 8/16. Students will receive a copy of their schedule during that Advisory time. They need to follow the schedule they receive the first day of school, just in case a few tweaks have been made. If students notice a <u>mistake</u> on their schedule, please encourage them to email their counselor this week - or else they will be sent a Google Form to sign up for a time to meet with their counselor the first week of school.

College Credit Plus (CCP): We are still missing some student's CCP requirements (paperwork and/or Sinclair's online application) that are necessary for students to be able to participate in CCP classes at FHS this school year. Mrs. Arlinghaus will be emailing students who are missing any requirements - so again, make sure your child is checking their school email and that they get this taken care of as soon as possible. Advanced Placement (AP) Testing: Information will soon be coming home about the May AP Exams. Exams must be ordered by early November or else hefty fees are incurred. The deposit for AP exams is \$40 per exam and that will be due at the time of registration. Students in AP classes at FHS will receive a letter with more details at the beginning of September. Stay tuned!

Advisory: Starting Monday, August 23, students will start Social Emotional Learning in his/her Advisory period. There will be a new topic every month with a different lesson every Monday. Students will learn about a variety of topics that will be useful to his/her personal and academic success (ie: Study Skills, Start with Hello, stress management, sleep, diet, anxiety, relationships, etc).

R.O.A.R. PRIDE:

As we kick-off the 2021-2022 school year, we have several exciting things happening here at Franklin High School. PBIS is one of the many exciting building-wide programs we believe in at FHS. PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Intervention & Supports. The entire concept of PBIS is to provide students additional social, emotional, and behavioral support. Oftentimes, this support manifests itself in providing students with as many positive interactions, experiences and opportunities as possible. To help with this process, our PBIS committee, along with input and feedback from students and staff, created our R.O.A.R. PRIDE Matrix. The purpose of the matrix is to promote a common language throughout our building with regards to our behavior expectations for students. As you will find, all of the wording within the matrix is positive and fosters healthy relationships among everyone in our building. With that being said, our PBIS slogan is R.O.A.R. PRIDE! Each letter of R.O.A.R represents a word that we believe is a fundamental pillar of success. R (Respect) O (Ownership) A (Attitude) R (Responsibility). R.O.A.R. is followed by PRIDE to emphasize the importance of taking pride in everything we do. Additionally, we wanted to preserve our time-honored traditions and values by reminding students of the fact that they're Once A Wildcat, Always A Wildcat!

As a way to recognize students, when teachers observe students exemplifying Respect, Ownership, Attitude or Responsibility throughout the school day, they will give those students a R.O.A.R. PRIDE INCENTIVE CARD. Students will then take their card and place it into the red box in the cafeteria for their grade level. At the end of the week we will draw names for students to receive incentives for their positive behavior. The cards will then be returned to the teachers who issued them to be posted in their classroom. Please take a moment to review the <u>R.O.A.R.
