WORLD WAR I VET PASSES AWAY

**Stanley Fabrycki Expires in
Hospital at Portland, Ore.
Burial in West**

Mr. and Mrs. Adam Fabrycki, 1620½ Arizona street, have received word of the death of their son, Stanley, in the Veterans hospital, Portland, Ore. He died Tuesday and is to be buried in the National cemetery, San Francisco.

He had been confined at the Oregon hospital since Aug. 5, 1942, for a condition resulting from the first World war.

He was born Feb. 20, 1898, in Neillsville, and moved here at an early age with his parents, having attended the Park school and graduated from the Oshkosh High school in 1919. He left Oshkosh in 1920 and spent most of his life in Alaska and on the west coast in the fishing industry.

His wife, Nellie, died three years ago. Surviving, besides the parents, are six brothers and four sisters, John, Paul and Sylvester of Oshkosh, Harry of Portland, Ore., Richard of Akron, O., Clement of Fort Sill, Okla., Mary Tayer of Waukegan, Ill., Sister Vita, the former Clara Fabrycki, of Tonqua, Pa., Anna Bolden, Chicago, and stationed at Shrdluuuu cago, and Lieut. Antonette Fabrycki, an army nurse, stationed at Truax Field, Madison.
