Board-certified behavior analysts are specifically trained in the science of behavior and work collaboratively to improve teaching and learning practices, and to promote positive student outcomes.

- Has earned a master's degree or higher
- BCBAs have completed supervision hours under a certified BCBA
- Has credentials through the Behavior Analyst Certification Board ®
- Kansas requires licensure for Licensed Behavior Analyst (LBA) for...
