What is the Telescope Network?

The Telescope Network is a partnership between the BTU and BPS to connect educators to learning opportunities, resources, and each other. The Telescope Network is part of the BPS Office of Educator Development & Leadership (OEDL). More info.

The Telescope Network creates opportunities for BPS educators to connect with peers across the district and learn from each other. To do this work:

- We ASK educators across the district what they want and need to learn next in order to best serve the needs of their students;
- We MAGNIFY effective practices by creating opportunities for effective and reflective educators to share their expertise with their peers; and
- We CONNECT educators to resources, professional learning opportunities, and each other based on their needs and interests.

What is OEDL?

The mission of the BPS Office of Educator Development & Leadership is to provide equitable access to sustaining opportunities for all BPS educators to grow, share, and lead in service of our students, school communities, and the profession at large.
