Aircraft Fleet: AAHF maintains and operates a collection of meticulously restored aircraft, including:

- **Bell UH-1H Iroquois ("Huey"):** A versatile utility helicopter renowned for its pivotal role during the Vietnam War.
- **Bell AH-1F Cobra:** The first dedicated attack helicopter, designed for close air support and armed escort missions.
- **Cessna L-19/O-1 Bird Dog:** A liaison and observation aircraft used for reconnaissance and forward air control.

Chapters and Locations: AAHF operates through regional chapters to broaden its reach and impact:

- **Legacy Chapter (Hampton, GA):** Located adjacent to the Atlanta Motor Speedway at the Henry County Airport, this chapter serves as the foundation's headquarters.
