**Step One:** Set up a Buncee account.

- Go to [Buncee](#) and create a user account as a student.
- Watch the quick instructional video of how to navigate and create or read this [instructional page](#) to give you some quick tips to get started.

**Step Two:** Create your first Buncee.

- Start from scratch or choose a template.

**Step Three:** Add 10 things about yourself. Ideas of what to include:

- Full name
- Birthday or air sign
- Pronouns
- Where you're from
- Favorite artist or type of art
- Hobbies
- Things you like to do when you're stressed out
- What helps calm you
- Your happy/zen place
- Exercises that help you
- Favorite songs
- Favorite movie
- Favorite series to watch
- Pets
- Family
- Favorite food
- Dream vacation
- Dream room or house
- Where you would like to travel to one day
- What you want to grow up and do
- Inspirational Quote
- Favorite book

**Step Four:** Include 6 or more images to represent the details about yourself.

**Step Five:** Include at least 3 links to those details. Refer to this [page](#) on how to do that. Ideas for links:

- Link to your favorite song
- Link to a recipe for your favorite food
- Clip of you doing your favorite sport or hobby
- Link to a picture of you with your family or of your pets

**Step Six:** Add your Buncee to the classroom Buncee Board

- Click on the + sign to add your Buncee.
- Paste the URL
