ABOUT MIGRATION OXFORD

Founded in 2017 and previously known as Migration and Mobility Network, [Migration Oxford](#) is an initiative and network that brings together academics working on migration and mobility from across the University of Oxford's research centres, divisions, and departments to foster interdisciplinary dialogue and collaborations.

Supported by an advisory board with representatives from ten research centres/departments of the University of Oxford, Migration Oxford currently features more than 500 members, and is hosted by the Global Exchange on Migration and Diversity (GEM) of the Centre on Migration, Policy, and Society (COMPAS).

The key aims of Migration Oxford are:

- To grow connections and facilitate interdisciplinary collaborations between researchers and students from across the university.
- To keep informed migration scholars based at Oxford of migration-related calls and events taking place at Oxford and beyond.
- To facilitate access to the University's expertise and research on migration and mobility.
- To promote knowledge exchange between scholars and the public.

To meet these aims, Migration Oxford hosts networking and interdisciplinary events; promotes relevant opportunities and calls of interest via our newsletter, website, and Twitter account; and showcases the work of migration research at Oxford through the Migration

Oxford podcast and by featuring the profiles of scholars working on migration and mobility on our website.

PURPOSE OF THE ROLE

Starting Trinity Term 2026, Migration Oxford is seeking a co-convenor to maintain and develop the network's activities and to continue strengthening already existing relationships between migration researchers from all departments of the University of Oxford while establishing new partnerships. The new co-convenor will share the leadership of Migration Oxford and respond to Jacqui Broadhead (Director of the Global Exchange on Migration and Diversity, Co-Director of COMPAS), and will take over as sole convenor at the end of Trinity Term 2025.

SUITABILITY AND TIME COMMITMENT

This role is ideally suited for a DPhil Candidate or Early Career Researcher currently enrolled or working at the University of Oxford. The role requires a time commitment of 2 hours per week during term time, with occasional additional hours when events need logistical and administrative support. The role is paid at Grade 6.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

These are to be shared between the two co-convenors, until the new convenor takes over responsibilities entirely at the end of term.

1. Managing communication channels

- Monitor and respond to queries sent to the Migration Oxford email
- Manage the Migration Oxford newsletter, which includes sending out weekly newsletters via Mailchimp during term time promoting migration-related events and opportunities and sending out occasional announcements to share news from our members
- Manage the Migration Oxford Twitter account
- Manage and maintain the Migration Oxford website
- Promote the Migration Oxford activities—including events and podcast episodes—via the newsletter, website, and Twitter

2. Maintain existing relationships and building new ones

- Inform and involve the advisory board in Migration Oxford's progress

- Present Migration Oxford during the Induction Week events organised by COMPAS and ODID for the MSc in Migration Studies; MSc in Forced Migration; and DPhil in Migration Studies
- Respond to queries from our members and be supportive in connecting our members for collaborations

3. Host and support scholars organise interdisciplinary events

- Ensure at least 1-2 events are being hosted by Migration Oxford every term
- Support the Oxford Migration Studies Society (OMSS) in running and organising the Annual Oxford Migration Conference taking place in Trinity Term
- Promote call for event proposals once a year to plan the event calendar of Migration Oxford
- Support scholars in framing and running the events of their choices

4. General

- Maintain regular communication with the co-convener and manager
- Be proactive in reviewing and evaluating own performance and identifying and acting upon areas for improvement and development
- When possible, the fortnight meetings of the Global Exchange of Migration and Diversity to share Migration Oxford updates and progress
- An understanding of and commitment to Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion
