Feb 13 2024	Under the Whispering Door	TJ Klune	"A Man Called Ove meets The Good Place, a delightful queer love story from the author of the New York Times and USA Today bestseller The House in the Cerulean Sea. When a reaper comes to collect Wallace from his own funeral, Wallace begins to suspect he might be dead. And when Hugo, the owner of a peculiar tea shop, promised to help him cross over, Wallace decides he's definitely dead. But even in death, he's not ready to abandon the life he barely lived, so when Wallace is given one week to cross over, he sets about living a lifetime in 7 days. In 1914, a young woman named Mary Russell meets a retired beekeeper on the Sussex Downs. His name is Sherlock Holmes. And although he may have all the Victorian "flaws" listed above, the Great Detective is no fool, and can spot a fellow intellect even in a 15 year old woman. So, at first informally, then consciously, he takes Mary as his apprentice. All the time, Mary is developing as a detective in her own right. They find themselves the targets of a slippery, murderous adversary. Together they devise a plan to trap their enemy- a plan that may save their lives but may also kill off their relationship.
April 9 2024	To Kill a Mockingbird	Harper Lee	Through the young eyes of Scout and Jem Finch, Harper Lee explores with rich humor and unswerving honesty the irrationality of adult attitudes toward race and class in the Deep South of the 1930s. The conscience of a town steeped in prejudice, violence, and hypocrisy is pricked by the stamina and quiet heroism of one man's struggle for justice-but the weight of history will only tolerate so much. One of the

			best-loved classics of all time, To Kill A Mockingbird has earned many distinctions since its original publication in 1960. It has won the Pulitzer Prize, been translated into more than 40 languages, sold more than 30 million copies worldwide, and been made into an enormously popular movie. Most recently, librarians across the country gave the book the highest of honors by voting it the best novel of the century (Library Journal)
May 14 2024	The Light Pirate	Lily Brooks-Dalton	Born during a powerful hurricane, Wanda, an unusual woman in a rapidly changing world, loses family, gains community and ultimately seeks adventure, love and purpose in a place abandoned by civilization and remade by nature.  ("An easy to read book about hurricanes in Florida. Good food for thought on climate change.")
June 11 2024	West with Giraffes	Lynda Rutledge	1938: The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in 2 giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing the Atlantic. What follows is a 12-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San Diego Zoo. Behind the wheel is the young Dust Bowl rowdy

			Woodrow Wilson Nickel. Present day: At 105, Woody feels his life ebbing away. When he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling an experience he cannot take to his grave. In retelling his story, he explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, and the passing of time.
July 9 2024	The Book Thief	Markus Zusak	Trying to make sense of the horrors of World War II, Death relates the story of Liesel, a young German girl whose book-stealing and story-telling talents help sustain her family and the Jewish man they are hiding, as well as their neighbors.
Aug 13 2024	The Lost Vintage	Ann Mah	Sweetbitter meets The Nightingale in this page-turner about a woman who returns to her family's ancestral vineyard in Burgundy to study for her Master of Wine test, and uncovers a lost diary, a forgotten relative, and a secret her family has been keeping since WWII. "If you enjoy mysteries, historical fiction, wine, French culture with a love story mixed in, you'll love this one."

Sept 10 2024	Demon Copperhead	Barbara Kingsolver	Oprah's Book Club 2022- From jacket: Southern Appalachia. He was born to a teen-aged single mother in a single-wide trailer, with no assets beyond his dead father's good looks and copper-colored hair, a caustic wit, and a fierce talent for survival. Damon braves the perils of foster care, child labor, derelict schools, athletic success, addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses.
Oct 8 2024	The Plot	Jean Hanff Korelitz	NY Times Bestseller Hailed as "breathtakingly suspenseful," a propulsive read about a story too good not to steal, and the writer who steals it.
