#### 1. Introduction (11 pt, bold, left align)

Journal KORIDOR uses an A4 paper size of 210 mm x 297 mm with upper, right, left, and bottom margins of 2 cm each from the edge of the paper with a single space paragraph. The font used is Times New Roman, and the length of the manuscript should not exceed 8 pages, including figures and tables (3000-4000 words). The title of the manuscript should be concise and informative and not exceed 14 words. Articles should meet the standard grammar requirement. Headings in English are organized as follows: Introduction, Methods, Discussion, Conclusion. Acknowledgments (if any) are placed after the conclusion and before the list of references. The appendix is only used when absolutely necessary to support the manuscript, for example, a questionnaire, citation of the law, transliteration of the manuscript, transcription of records, maps, drawings, or tables/charts of the results of the analytical calculations. Attachments are placed after the list of references. (Spacing after 12 pt)

## 1.1 Tables (11 pt, italic, left align)

All tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Every table should have a caption. Headings should be placed above tables, left justified. Only horizontal lines should be used within a table, to distinguish the column headings from the body of the table, and immediately above and below the table. Tables must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. Below is an example which the authors may find useful. (Spacing after 12 pt)

### 1.2 Section headings (11 pt, italic, left align)

Section headings should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalized and numbered consecutively, starting with the Introduction. Sub-section headings should be in capital and lower-case italic letters, numbered 1.1, 1.2, etc, and left justified, with second and subsequent lines indented. All headings should have a minimum of two text lines after them before a page or column break. Ensure the text area is not blank except for the last page. (Spacing after 12 pt)

## 1.3 General guidelines for the preparation of your text (11 pt, italic, left align)

Avoid hyphenation at the end of a line. Symbols denoting vectors and matrices should be indicated in bold type. Scalar variable names should normally be expressed using italics. Weights and measures should be expressed in SI units. All non-standard abbreviations or symbols must be defined when first mentioned, or a glossary provided (*Spacing after 12 pt*)

### 3. Discussion (11 pt, bold, left align)

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3,.). Every figure should have a caption. All photographs, schemas, graphs and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. Line drawings should be good quality scans or true electronic output. Low-quality scans are not acceptable. Figures must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. In MS word input the figures must be properly coded. Preferred format of figures are PNG, JPEG, GIF etc. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the caption or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper. Please ensure that all the figures are of 300 DPI resolutions as this will facilitate good output. The figure number and caption should be typed below the illustration in 8 pt and left justified [Note: one-line captions of length less than column width (or

full typesetting width or oblong) centered]. 


Figure 1. (a) first picture; (b) second picture.

### 5. Acknowledgements (if any) (11 pt, bold, left align)

Acknowledgements and Reference heading should be left justified, bold, with the first letter capitalized but have no numbers. Text below continues as normal. (Spacing after 12 pt)

#### References (11 pt, bold, left align)

The reference list is written with the APA style (author-date) format. The library must have a minimum of 15 references in last 5 years. **One of the references must cite a paper published in the Jurnal KORIDOR**.
