Graduation questions answered:

- **Q:** Do I need to order my cap and gown? When will I get them?
 - **A:** No, we've ordered and paid for them already. You will get them after senior awards on Monday, May 19th.
- Q: Can I decorate my cap?
 - A: No, P.K. has a tradition of not having graduation caps decorated at the graduation ceremony. However, the caps and gown are yours to keep, so you may decorate it at any other time except the ceremony.
- Q: I earned cords/sashes/medals. When will I get them?
 - **A:** All school-sponsored graduation regalia will be given out at Senior Awards on Monday, May 19th at 12:15.
- Q: What is Wave Walk?
 - **A:** Wave Walk is a P.K. tradition where all seniors wear their caps and gowns and parade through the school, beginning in the elementary

building and ending in front of the gym. The faculty and students line the sidewalks to "say goodbye" to the graduating seniors. This year, Wave Walk will take place following the Senior Awards on Monday, May 19th.

- Q: How many tickets can I get for graduation?
 - A: Each senior will get 10 tickets at graduation rehearsal at 9 am on Friday, May 23rd. YOU MUST ATTEND REHEARSAL IN ORDER TO GET YOUR TICKETS.
- **Q**: What if I need more than 10 tickets?
 - A: You may ask your friends if they need all 10 of theirs. There will also be a table set up in front of the Phillips Center an hour before graduation with extra tickets. These will be distributed on a first-come, first-serve basis. One ticket per person.

The Randy Norris Scholarship was established in memory of Lieutenant Randy Norris, Jr. who served as a P.K. Yonge school resource officer and lost his life at an early age.

A partial scholarship will be awarded to graduate(s) of P.K. Yonge Developmental Research School with a preference for those intending to pursue a career in law enforcement or education.

For the 2025 graduating class, two \$1,500 scholarships will be awarded to those students in good standing accepted to a college or university, and declaring a major in law enforcement or education. Awardees will be selected by a committee of administrators, counselors, and teachers. Letters of Recommendation

Many of you may need letters of recommendation for scholarships/job applications/college admissions. Your teachers prioritize writing strong letters on your behalf, and we would like to remind you of the following best practices when requesting a letter of recommendation:

- 1. Plan for the application process. Try to give as much notice as possible to your recommender. Most recommenders value at least a week's notice for the request.
- 2. Personally speak with the teacher/faculty member if at all possible. Explain what the letter of recommendation is for and timeline. You should also ask what the recommender needs from you (resume, extracurricular activities, etc.). Be prepared to share when you will need the letter, and how the recommender will submit the letter on your behalf. Generally ask if the person is willing to write a letter on your behalf, and if they agree let them know you will follow-up with all of the information in an email.
- 3. In the follow-up email, include what you discussed in person. Make sure to reiterate the purpose of the letter, timeline, and submission details. Send any documents the recommender requested to make sure you have the strongest letter possible.

Alachua Conservation Trust is pleased to announce the 2025 Florida Wild for All Scholarship. With this scholarship award, ACT seeks to amplify and celebrate the existing voices of Black, Indigenous, Latinx, and Multiracial People of Color interested in pursuing a career path in natural resources management or protection of the environment of Florida.

Selected recipients will be awarded \$250-500 for the 2025-2026 school year, which can be used for expenses as they relate to pursuing a career path in the environment and/or natural resource management fields. Awardees will also be invited to participate in future ACT community events and programs, including the ACT Internship Program, which provides students and recent graduates with the skills and training needed to pursue a career in the natural resources or nonprofit fields.
