Student/Parent Announcement

The peak of the cold and flu season is upon us. To prevent the widespread of flu in school and the community, we recommend that your child stay home from school if experiencing flu or cold symptoms. To decide whether or not to send your child to school, please consider the following guidelines:

Consider keeping your child at home for an extra day of rest and observation if he or she has any of the following symptoms:

- Very stuffy or runny nose and/or cough
- Mild sore throat (no fever, no known exposure to strep)
- Headache
- Mild stomach ache

Definitely keep your child at home for treatment and observation if he or she has any of these symptoms:

- Fever (greater than 100 degrees by mouth and your child may return to school only after his or her temperature has been consistently below 100 degrees, by mouth, for a minimum of 24 hours)
- Vomiting (even once)
- Diarrhea
- Chills
- General malaise or feelings of fatigue, discomfort, weakness or muscle aches
- Frequent congested (wet) or croupy cough
- Lots of nasal congestion with frequent blowing of nose

To help prevent the flu and other colds, teach your children good hygiene habits:

- Wash hands frequently
- Do not touch eyes, nose or mouth
- Cover mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing, use a paper tissue, throw it away and then wash hands
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Colds are the most contagious during the first 48 hours. A child who has a fever should remain at home until "fever free" for a minimum of 24 hours without the aid of medication. A child who has started antibiotics needs to be on the medication for 24 hours before considered non-contagious and able to return to school. Often when a child awakens with vague complaints (the way colds and flu begin) it is wise to observe your child at home for an hour or two before deciding whether or not to bring to school. Your child should be physically able to participate in all school activities on return to school. Keeping a sick child at home will minimize the spread of infections and viruses in the classroom.

Awareness to a few things related to the **prom**.

- 1) **Any student attending Prom must have an extra curricular drug consent form on file.**
- 2) This year's prom will be at the Lawrenceburg Event Center on **Saturday April 27, 2019**
- 3) Prom tickets may **ONLY** be purchased by a member of the current LHS Junior or Senior class
- 4) Each Junior/Senior is permitted to bring **ONE** guest outside of the current LHS Junior or Senior class. If the Junior/Senior chooses to walk through Prom Preview, their outside guest **must** walk with them. The guest **must** be seated at the same table as the Junior/Senior.
- 5) Any guest who is not a current LHS student will require an LHS approved permission slip.
- 6) Guests must be at least high school age and no older than 20 years old.
- 7) Prom tickets will go on sale on a date that has yet to be determined. More information regarding ticket sales will come at a later date.
