Appointed Staff Committees and Descriptions

School Representation Committee *NEW*

Composed of liaisons from all 12 high schools, Homewood, and 20 middle schools, the School Representation Committee seeks to connect high schoolers with similar interests to HCASC. As representatives of each school, the School Liaisons provide direct feedback to the Student Member of the Board (SMOB). The School Representation Committee also aids in the coordination between existing student organizations. Members of this committee will be required to report to the HCASC OT on local school events and how they have promoted HCASC in their home schools. **Per policy 2010, School Representatives to HCASC and the Board of Education are automatically considered school liaisons.**

In addition to these responsibilities, school liaisons *must attend any HCASC events at their home school or feeder high school* and assist the Officer Team with technology, including but not limited to hosting virtual sessions in hybrid meetings, facilitating breakout room conversions, etc.

Accessibility Committee *NEW*

The Accessibility Committee seeks to ensure that all aspects of HCASC and HCPSS are accessible. Part of the role of this committee is to translate HCASC materials, posts, and content into other languages. This committee also seeks to ensure that middle and high schools have access to menstrual products and other necessary resources for students to succeed.

Mentorship Committee *NEW*

The Mentorship Committee connects middle and high school students through a mentorship program so they can share advice, tips, and next steps. This committee also seeks to ensure that students in Howard County have the necessary skills, such as resume-building and effective email drafting, to succeed and pursue their passions.

Arts Committee

The Arts Committee promotes arts-related activities and opportunities, reaches out to school clubs and community groups, and brings ideas and concerns from county-wide groups back to HCASC and the Student Member. This committee often works in conjunction with other committees to add an artistic perspective to their committee projects.





Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee (DEI) operates within HCASC to provide a safe and secure environment for students of all ethnicities, races, genders, and backgrounds. It creates platforms for Howard County students to voice their opinions against injustice, working with the Legislative Affairs Committee to uplift the importance of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion within HCASC and HCPSS. This could include conducting research, writing legislative stances, and helping promote & support legislative stances on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

Election Coordinating Committee

The Election Coordinating Committee (ECC) coordinates the general and special elections for HCASC. ECC takes the lead in planning for Delegate Training and the SMOB Convention, with the chairperson serving as Convention Director. They work in conjunction with the Officer Team and Mrs. Drummond in planning and promoting the process of electing the Student Member of the Board for the next school year.

Environmental Affairs Committee

The Environmental Affairs Committee (EAC) engages with environmental issues and builds relationships with school clubs and community groups to promote environmental-related activities and opportunities for HCASC. They also maintain a monthly newsletter to spread environmental awareness and provide service opportunities for students. This committee also collects feedback from HCPSS students and community organizations to pursue environmental related projects.

Health and Social Issues Committee

The Health and Social Issues Committee promotes health and social issues awareness, providing leadership for HCASC initiatives. This committee researches and shares state and county regulations and statutes regarding Safe Schools Initiatives, Mental Health, Discrimination, and Bullying/ Harassment policies. The committee also builds relationships with school clubs and community groups to promote health and social issue-related activities and opportunities for HCASC.

Legislative Affairs Committee

The Legislative Affairs Committee (LAC) seeks to empower HCASC and all Howard County students to understand the advocacy process at all levels of government. The LAC





assists in developing official HCASC committee stances relating to policies and legislation pertinent to youth and education. The Legislative Affairs Committee will also be responsible for creating "policy summaries" that explain to students what the policy means and its impacts on the school system. Finally, the Legislative Affairs Committee will be responsible for coaching policy review students and giving them an overview of the process.

Public Relations Committee

The Public Relations (PR) Committee manages the HCASC web page and social media presence in partnership with the HCASC advisor and Corresponding Secretary and continually works to improve the communications between HCASC and HCPSS schools through newsletters, social media, and web publications.

STEM Committee

The STEM Committee fosters a system to promote STEM-related activities and opportunities, reaches out to school clubs and community groups to promote STEM-related activities and opportunities, bringing ideas and concerns from county-wide groups back to HCASC and the Student Member.
