Event Rules

4 entries per team

Contestants must choose a story from any source, published or unpublished. The story MUST be told with NO manuscript or notes are allowed. Paraphrasing and improvisation are allowed and encouraged. The story must have literary or historical value and it must be appropriate for a high school audience. While stories may come from any source, examples might include cultural tales, regional stories, oral histories, fables, Biblical stories, etc. The event is designed to entertain the audience as storytelling combines elements of acting AND interpretation. The storytellers must rely on their voice, facial expressions, gestures, and movements to create the story. There are NO restrictions on movement. Contestants MAY use the space and furniture in the room however they please. Props are permitted. Makeup and costumes are not permitted. No special sound effects, lighting, or offstage voices will be allowed.

TIME LIMIT: 5 minutes maximum including an introduction.
