SOLVENCY: Here's why Saudi Arabia has no choice but to stick with us.

It's not just that we sell them tens of billions of dollars more than anyone else. It's that their entire weapons infrastructure is American.

You can't fire Chinese bullets from an American gun. You can't drop Chinese missiles from an American plane. You really can't even land a Chinese jet on an American aircraft carrier. Saudi Arabia has gone all in on the United States.

Reuters <u>reports</u> on February 5th of 2024 that Lockheed Martin has even agreed to build a factory near Riyadh for Saudi Arabian companies to manufacture platform weaponry. **Rep. Arul**, <u>we are</u> Saudi Arabia's domestic weapons production.

The bottom line is this: we have leverage over Saudi Arabia. Use it, don't lose it.

IMPACT:
